Search and you will be found!

Last week I googled 'green paint for small living room' as I need to paint my house and am starting with the living room. I also googled 'mother-of-the-bride dress' as a friend has engaged me to help her find something for her daughter's wedding and as I'm not a fashion browser I needed to look up what is currently available!

As a consequence, I'm receiving constant pop-ups in my emails, on my Facebook page and Instagram regarding green paint products and elegant dresses in expensive boutiques. Some of the feeds were actually helpful but the unfortunate part of tapping into the feeds is that the feeds concerning related topics and information increase and become more diverse with each click! Now, that's not a problem for me as I have already moved on from the research with both items – closer to current dormancy re the painting task while the mother-of-the bride is now sorted (not by me)! I'm now blocking anything which pops up re green paint and dresses, so it will fade away.

We are all people of habit. Physically we generally go for walks in a few of the same places, read from particular genres, eat the same selection of foods each month, meet friends in the same places, pray in a particular way, etc. We have healthy and unhealthy habits which we are trying to constantly reinforce and break respectively. Often, we are not even aware of particular habits unless someone points out the pattern or asks us to do something a different way. Such habits which are clearly observable to others are readily open to question and challenge or affirmation.

Our use of social media and search engines is clearly observable to the commercial and influencing world which is linked directly to the search engines but not to our friends. No search is free! The cost of every search is that we can be found by thousands of organisations with one click on a search engine and fed a media diet of their deliberate choice. It can lead to a habitual pattern of searches and receipt of a bombardment of particular feeds, all of which occurs in the rooms of our own houses.

Organisations feeding links, have a purpose to draw us towards their products or influence with a gain which is in some way material. The material purpose may be subliminal or overt with any moment spent clicking or viewing being akin to keeping the door open on an unwanted door-to-door salesperson. Unlike the door-to-door salesperson who presents as a sole person, the online salespersons multiply by the second so it is more difficult to close the door the longer it is held open!

Activity on social media and search engines occurs behind closed doors so any filtering of feeds is freely chosen by ourselves. Every decision to search outside that which is for a functional purpose needs a **STOP** at junction sign before proceeding because whatever we read, see or hear cannot be unread, unseen or unheard! We have all seen images which we would like to unsee! The pop-up ads arrive in our pockets every minute and on every opening of a page on the internet appealing to click-expressed, one-time interest in a related product or topic. I prefer to be in control of my clicks rather than the clicks being in control of me! I'll continue my blocking pattern!

Food Safety Authority of Ireland

The Food Safety Authority of Ireland (FSAI) is an independent statutory organisation. It was established by the Food Safety Authority of Ireland Act, 1998.

The FSAI protects consumers by ensuring that standards for food safety and hygiene are met when food is consumed, produced, distributed or marketed in Ireland. It works with other official agencies, including the Health Service Executive (HSE), to enforce food safety legislation in Ireland.

What does the FSAI do?

The FSAI is responsible for:

Sending food safety inspectors to test food samples for contamination

Referring complaints about food safety from the public to the relevant Environmental Health Office

Training food safety inspectors and other food industry workers about food law

Telling the public when there is a food safety issue, such as a product recall or restaurant closure

Investigating food labels and fraudulent food Developing food safety guidelines

Advising on national nutrition policy

The FSAI also works with other state agencies to ensure that food law is enforced, including the

Sea-Fisheries Protection Authority and the Health Service Executive (HSE).

Enforcement of food safety laws

The FSAI has service contracts with other official agencies, including the HSE and the Sea-Fisheries Protection Authority, to make sure all food premises comply with food safety laws. *The FSAI is responsible for:*

Co-ordinating the enforcement of food safety legislation in Ireland

Supporting Ireland's food safety regulators (such as Environmental Health Officers) to implement a fair, consistent and effective system of enforcement

Managing risks in the food chain and responding to any national or international food incidents Ensuring the safety of the food chain by detecting, deterring and preventing breaches of food law Researching food safety through coordinated studies and scientific collaboration The FSAI can also seek reports from any state body on matters affecting food safety. It reports to the Minister for Health.

Environmental Health Officers

The FSAI works with Environmental Health Officers from the HSE to inspect food premises. *Environmental Health Officers can:* Enter and inspect food premises Secure a food premises for later inspection Inspect and, if necessary, remove records Take samples of food or related materials, and have these samples analysed It is an offence to obstruct an officer carrying out this duty.

You can find contact details for your local Environmental Health Officer on the HSE website.

Improvement notices

If the Environmental Health Officer finds that a premises or a practice (such as food handling or preparation) is likely to be a risk to public health, they may give the owner an improvement notice. *This includes:*

The cause of the risk to public health The remedial action that needs to be taken The time limit for the owner to take remedial action

Training for all St Patrick's Volunteers

The church has built strong protections for children, vulnerable people, volunteers and staff so that safety for all is as high as possible. However, while the standard is high, it is vital that we all continue to build the best possible practice to ensure that safeguarding is always a foundational priority.

The diocese has an appointed safe guarding training service:

The Designated Liaison Person (Parish Priest), all clergy, safe guarding representatives and **ALL** volunteers and employees **MUST** avail of initial training and ongoing training every three years in order to remain engaged in service.

ALL VOLUNTEERS on Wednesday 17th April at 7.00p.m. in St Mary's Church.

Elizabeth Mc Nicholas is a young person from Lucan living with severe brain and spinal injuries. She is a full-time wheelchair user with complex medical needs and severe neuropathic pain. Elizabeth was a camogie player before her illness, and now struggles to get some normality back into her life. She was first diagnosed with her illness in her Leaving Cert year in Coláiste Cois Life. She went on to do Domestic Science teacher-training in St. Angela's College, Sligo, but unfortunately she had to pull out of that course.

In 2018, Elizabeth spent three months in a hospital in Istanbul, to undergo a series of extremely major life-saving and life-changing surgeries. These surgeries gave Elizabeth some hope to get her life back to normal, and since then, she has been working hard to adapt to her new life and to regain some of the functions and abilities that she lost over the years.

Due to the complex nature of Elizabeth's condition, she requires ongoing specialist neurorehabilitation which is not available to her in Ireland. During the past two Summers, Elizabeth has undergone neurorehabilitation at Neurokinex Gatwick in the UK, making significant strides in her recovery, such as learning to sit upright unaided and regaining better function in her right arm. Elizabeth hopes to return to Neurokinex Gatwick for further intensive neurorehabilitation over the coming months, but this therapy does not come cheap. Fundraising continues to facilitate access to this vital treatment for Elizabeth, to give her the chance she deserves.

St. Mary's Camera Soirée

Last week a number of the members of the Soiree brought in the albums that they had created from their photographs and we admired the results. We look forward to seeing the results from other members in the coming weeks.

The theme chosen for photographs during the month of April – "windows" - continues to attract novel and imaginative pictures with Conor submitting one entitled *"48 windows"* which is a light house lantern at Howth and one entitled *"concrete windows"* which I think is part of the old St. Ita's Hospital in Portrane.



Donal has been up around the northwest and has sent in beautiful photographs of the landscape there. One in particular taken in Kincasslagh, Co. Donegal (the birth place of Daniel O'Donnell) includes in the distance a Napoleonic signal tower.



He also introduced us to a new bird resident in Ireland, migrating from central and eastern Europe – *the Blackcap* – which he found in Lucan Demesne.





These towers were an early-19th-century communication system constructed in response to the threat of a French invasion. Sited in remote coastal locations, most of these signal towers were constructed between 1804 and 1806. The signalling system required that each signal station be visible to its counterparts on either side. The process of sending a message involved raising and lowering a large rectangular flag, a



smaller blue pendant and four black balls or hoops in various combinations along a system centred on a tall wooden mast. The threat of invasion was significantly diminished following Napoleon's defeat at Waterloo in 1815 and, as maintenance of the structures was costly, given their remote locations, many were abandoned.
