### Know Your Rights: Parent's leave - What's New

This news item was posted on April 8, 2021

I am due to have a baby in three months and have arranged to take Maternity Leave. Am I entitled to any more paid leave to look after the baby?

Parent's leave is a statutory entitlement for parents that allows each parent 5 weeks paid leave for a child born or adopted on or after 1 November 2019. It aims to let working parents spend more time with their child.

It must be taken within 2 years of the birth of a child or in the case of adoption, from the date of placement of the child. If you have enough PRSI contributions, you get a weekly Parent's Benefit payment of €245 from the Department of Social Protection during parent's leave.

You can take parent's leave in one 5-week block or in 5 one-week periods. You can visit citizensinformation.ie to find more about parent's leave.

Parent's leave is different to parental leave. Parental leave is unpaid and can be taken up until the child's 12th birthday.

# Summary of leave available for parents

**Maternity leave** - Female employees, 26 weeks and up to 16 unpaid weeks.

Yes, Maternity Benefit is paid for 26 weeks. **Adoptive leave** - One parent of an adopting couple or a parent adopting alone. 24 weeks and up to 16 unpaid weeks.

Yes, Adoptive Benefit is paid for 24 weeks

Paternity leave - A parent of a child under 6 months of age (usually the father or partner of the mother, or in the case of adoption, the parent who is not taking adoptive leave), 2 weeks.

Yes, Paternity Benefit is paid for 2 weeks

Parental leave - Parents and guardians of children under 1226 weeks. No, it's unpaid

**Parent's leave** - Parents of children under 2 years of age (or in first 2 years of adoption placement), 5 weeks.

Yes, Parent's Benefit can be paid for 5 weeks



tools and building equipment. Efforts are underway to trace owners of the property.



School news: We were delighted to welcome back all of our students on Monday for the 1<sup>st</sup> time this year. It has been a particularly challenging time for our 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> yrs, as well as our TY students, who had been engaged in remote learning up until the Easter holidays so it was fantastic to see our students reconnecting with their school friends and re-engaging with their teachers in-person in the classrooms this week for the 1<sup>st</sup> time since before Christmas. They all looked really happy to be back in school (although some of them might deny it!) and hopefully schools will remain open for all from here on in.

Awards: The end of term award winners were announced this week with eight main awards given out. For the Online Engagement Term award, students were nominated by their subject teachers based on their engagement levels with remote learning since the schools were closed at

Their excellent attendance, punctuality, attentiveness, enthusiasm, good manners, initiative, impressive motivation levels, positive attitudes and timely submission of homework assignments in an extremely challenging period in their education has been truly uplifting and inspiring.

Coláiste Phádraig has a very proud tradition of presenting awards to deserving students and the following beautiful Irish proverb perhaps best encapsulates the school's philosophy: "Mol an óige agus tiocfaidh siad. Cáin an óige agus titfith siad" (Praise the youth and they will flourish, criticise the youth and they will fall).

Wellbeing: Just a correction to the title of the Wellbeing book mentioned in the Lucan newsletter before the Easter break. The title should have read "My Busy Popcorn Mind" (rather than "popping" mind) and the book is being self-published by Jackie Farrell, a teacher in the school.

DCG: Our 6<sup>th</sup> yr DCG students were busy just before the Easter Break putting the final touches to their Leaving Cert projects and portfolios that they have been working on throughout school year. These form 40% of the overall marks with the written exam in June worth the remaining 60%. The extended deadline was Friday 19<sup>th</sup> March this year and this day witnessed the usual final few stragglers and procrastinators staying around late after school in a desperate last minute rush to complete their projects on time! We've all been there!

Their brief was to carry out a design investigation of existing dash-cams (dashboard cameras) that can be bought in shops, in graphic form and then develop and graphically communicate a new concept design for a dash-cam based on a selected theme or target market. The students had to take inspiration from something in the real world with some ideas being inspired by iguanas, retro cameras and air fresheners.

Once they sketched up their final design they then had to make them on Solidworks (a 3D software package used in DCG Classrooms that allows students to model every-day objects). They then had to put together a portfolio showcasing all of their work and submit it for assessment by external examiners. Hopefully they will all be rewarded with high grades!

# St. Mary's Camera Soirée


