Alleluia – He is Risen!



We live in dark and uncertain times. The conflicts in Gaza and Ukraine rank as the most serious conflicts among many more throughout our world. We live in an age of unprecedented weaponry, missiles capable of destruction on a scale never seen before.

Power seems concentrated into the hands of individuals, with the capacity to start a global conflict of unimaginable proportions.

These are scary times.

This weekend we are celebrating a message of joy and immeasurable hope, a message that proclaims the victory of love over hatred, of light over darkness, of life over death. Jesus had undergone his own unimaginable horror: rejection, false accusations, taunts, suffering and finally death like a criminal. This was a story that had seemingly ended in tragedy. His disciples had abandoned him. Even Peter his chief Lieutenant had denied all knowledge of him, it seemed as if all had ended in tears. Easter morning was to change all that. The light that they thought to be extinguished was burning brightly again.

The Tomb of death had become the place of resurrection, the love that burned in the heart of Jesus was a fire that would ignite the faith of billions yet unborn. Easter changed everything.

In the days and weeks that followed the disciples were to have many encounters with the Risen Lord, these were moments of reconciliation and healing, moments of restoration and communion. No more skulking around behind locked doors, no longer paralysed by fear; the Risen Jesus transformed them. Even Peter was empowered to undo his threefold denial with a threefold profession of love and faith. No finger of accusation or condemnation from Jesus, rather compassionate understanding and healing.

The ultimate message of Easter is that God is in control. When humankind does its worst, the love of God prevails. Jesus would remain with them awhile, but the time for his Ascension would come. It was then that the Holy Spirit would be poured out on them, they would literally be "clothed with power from on high." (*Lk* 24:49). The best indeed was yet to come, and it still is!

May the light of His love burn in our hearts. Happy Easter!

Buying a Used Car

When you buy a used car from a trader (a car dealer, garage or a business selling on an online marketplace), you have similar consumer rights as when buying a new car.

You can expect the car to meet certain conditions of quality and durability and match what was set out in the contract. While you can't expect a used car to be the same standard as a new one, the quality should reflect the price you paid. If you buy at an auction, you don't have the same rights if the car is 'sold as seen'. Check the auction's conditions of sale before you buy.

If you buy from a private seller, you also have fewer legal rights. This is because consumer law applies to contracts between a trader and a consumer and does not cover consumer-toconsumer deals.

You bought from a garage or car dealer

If a used car you bought develops a fault, you have the right to ask the garage or car dealer to fix the problem by:

Repairing the faulty part(s) for free, within a reasonable time and without significant inconvenience to you.

Providing a replacement part or a car of similar quality or value.

Giving you a refund of the full price paid or a partial refund with a deduction for use (also known as recission)

Car is still under warranty

If your car was sold with a manufacturer's warranty, this provides extra protections. Check the terms and conditions to see if the warranty is still in date, what problems are covered and what the seller's obligations are.

Used car warranties are agreed between you and the dealer when you are negotiating the sale. They are usually non-transferable. This means that you will have to go back to the garage or car dealer you bought the car from to get repairs done under that warranty.

A warranty or guarantee gives you extra protections but it does not replace your statutory rights when goods are faulty. The seller still has a legal duty to provide you with a repair, replacement or refund if the car turns out not to be of satisfactory quality and durability or match what was set out in the contract.

You bought from a private seller

You have very few legal rights when you buy a car from a private seller. Consumer laws only apply to deals between a consumer (a person who buys a good or service for personal use or consumption) and a trader (a person acting for purposes related to their trade, business or profession). It does not apply when you buy from a private individual who is not a trader (for example, someone who is selling their own car to you but who does not sell cars as a profession)

You should still contact the seller to try to work out a solution. If you can't resolve the problem, you can take a civil case.

St Mary's Divine Mercy devotion:

Faithful followers of Jesus are asked to pray fervently for the Church and the whole world in these troubled and dangerous times. The Christian message is to love God above all else, and to love our neighbour as we love ourselves. This is being increasingly ignored and rejected. More and more, the world is ignoring God and attempting to rewrite the Ten Commandments to suit its own sinful ways.

Jesus requested that the Feast of Divine Mercy (the Sunday after Easter Sunday) be preceded by a Novena of Chaplets of Divine Mercy beginning on Good Friday.

This year, we hope that many people will pray the Novena, either on their own or with their families for change to come about in the world, with more and more turning away from evil and instead turning to God, by repenting and seeking His Mercy for our sins and the sins of the whole world.




Was there a bed in Lucan that didn't have a Hill's blanket over the years?

Stuart will also give a brief look at the Augustinian canons that were there from the 1000s-1541 and indeed the relatively recent revelation that the cathedral was founded as a Benedictine cathedral priory.


Darkness Into Light Lucan: 2025:

Michael G was in Limerick during the week and came across an art installation called the Container Garden located in the "garden" of a hotel in Limerick's Georgian Quarter. The idea was to create a unique urban oasis

with pieces associated with the travel and hospitality industries in the 1950s. The highlight for me was the front half of a sawn in two Ford Prefect car bursting with grasses. According to Wikipedia the Ford Prefect was a line of British cars which was produced between 1938 and 1961 as an upmarket version of the Ford Popular and Ford Anglia.

In Ireland, the Prefect was assembled at the Ford Cork plant until 1962. Throughout its life

there were a number of redesigns. The final model (from 1959) cost £621 sterling and this price did not include a heater, windscreen washers, radio and leather upholstery.
