For the first time since Holy Week 2019 we will this year have public ceremonies to mark these sacred days of the church calendar. Holy Week is a special time of celebration when we commemorate those last days of the Lord's earthly life, his passion, death and resurrection.

Holy Thursday celebrates the night before his death, when Jesus gathered around him those special friends and instituted the Eucharist. It is an opportunity for the Christian community to come together to consolidate faith in the Eucharist and to strengthen the bonds of communion among us. The Solemn celebration of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday night incorporates the ritual washing of feet. Jesus on that night took on the role of a servant and washed the feet of his disciples. In those times visitors to a home were greeted by a servant who would wash their dusty feet before they were shown in to join the family. In assuming this role, Jesus was making an important statement. He was giving an example of humble service that the disciples were to emulate. In choosing his moment at the last supper Jesus made a link between Eucharist and the call to service of others, a call that we are all called to answer. The whole celebration of Holy Thursday prefigures the events of the following day when self-sacrificing love would express itself in total giving.

The Holy Thursday liturgy ends with the removal of the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose which in St. Mary's is located in the parish centre, this recalls the time spent by the Lord in the garden at Gethsemane. A guided 'Watch and Pray' hour takes place here from 10:00 – 11:00 PM. (Mk 14:34 "Could you not watch one hour with me.")

Good Friday remembers that day on which Jesus made the supreme sacrifice of his life on the cross for us. At 12:00 noon the four Christian Churches of Lucan, Catholic, Church of Ireland, Presbyterian and Methodist come together to walk in united witness to Christ. The walk begins with prayer in St. Mary's and proceeds down the hill to the Methodist Church where we again pause for prayer and reflection, we then move to the Presbyterian Church for prayer and finally on to St. Andrew's Church of Ireland for the concluding prayers. St. Andrews's kindly host a cuppa for all in the parish centre adjacent to the church. It is a lovely opportunity for us to bear united witness.

Holy Saturday night sees the celebration of the Easter Vigil, when we gather to keep vigil in preparation for the celebration of the triumph of Christ's Resurrection. This Liturgy begins at 9:00 pm in St. Mary's with the outdoor blessing of the Easter Fire. The Paschal Candle is blessed and lit and a light from that candle is passed to every member of the congregation. **John 1:5** says, "*The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.*" Tonight we renew our Baptismal commitment and embrace our faith renewed by the light of the Resurrection.

Easter Sunday offers another opportunity for Ecumenical witness when members of the four churches are invited to a sunrise service in Hermitage Golf Course. Sunrise is at 6:19 am The gathering will be about 6:10 am. All are welcome.

The past two years have been strange and difficult times for all of us. As we prepare for Holy Week and Easter we pray that our celebration of the Christ's life death and resurrection may fill us all with fresh heart and hope.

Census 2022

The next census will take place on **3 April 2022**. This is a year later than planned because of COVID-19. Following a consultation process and pilot survey, the CSO announced the introduction of eight new questions for the next census.

These include questions on:

Renewable energy sources, Internet access and devices, Smoke alarms, Smoking, Working from home, Volunteering, Childcare.

Travelling home from work, school or college
You can read the new questions on census.ie.

Changes were also agreed to 25 existing questions on disability, ethnic groups, religion and the Irish language.

The census in 2022 will include an optional 'time capsule' question for the first time. This will allow members of the public to write a confidential message of their choice which will be securely stored for 100 years.

What is the €200 electricity account credit?

Domestic electricity customers, including pay as you go customers, will get a one-off, exceptional payment of €200 in 2022.

The payment will be automatic, and you will not need to apply for it. The €200 credit (including VAT) will be paid between April and June 2022. The Electricity Costs Emergency Benefit Scheme is part of the package of supports to combat the cost of living. The Commission for the Regulation of Utilities (CRU) will oversee the scheme.

Am I eligible for the credit?

The scheme applies to all domestic electricity accounts registered with an electricity supplier in the Republic of Ireland.

You will be eligible for the scheme if, on 29 March 2022, you are registered as either:

An urban domestic customer (classified as DG1)

A rural domestic customers (classified as DG2)

Can I get the credit for my holiday home?

The credit will apply to every domestic electricity account. This means that if you have multiple homes in Ireland with a domestic electricity account you will get the credit for each account.

When will I get the credit?

The payment will be automatic, and you will not need to apply for it. The €200 credit (including VAT) will be paid between April and June 2022. You will see a 'credit line' on your bill in the amount of €176.22 (this is €200 excluding VAT). It will have the identifier 'Government Electricity Credit' or an abbreviated version of this depending on your supplier (for example Govt. Credit, Govt. Cr, Gov CR). Suppliers will have information on their websites with the exact dates the credit will show on their customers' bills.

I use pre-pay electricity

Your supplier will contact you by letter or email between April and June, to explain how you will receive your credit. Most pre-pay electricity meters will accept the €200 credit in full.

Hardship meters

If you have an older pre-pay meter that has a pre-pay limit, you can redeem your electricity credit over 3 separate top-ups (vends), over the space of a few days. This means the €200 electricity credit will be applied over 3 separate top-ups.

For example, customers using hardship prepay meters have a €300 credit limit, and the €200 credit could put the meter over the limit. Instead, the €200 credit will be broken down into 3 smaller credits of €90, €90 and €20.

To redeem your 3 smaller credits, you should pay €10 towards your electricity. Your credit will then be automatically added to the top-up. You should allow one day between each €10 payment.

I am in rented accommodation: If you are a tenant in rented accommodation and you pay your landlord directly for your electricity (rather than the electricity provider), your landlord should pass the credit on to you.

If there is a dispute between you and your landlord, you should try to resolve this informally. If you cannot come to an agreement, you can contact the RTB's free mediation service, where an independent mediator will help you reach an agreement. Or, you can apply for 'adjudication' with the RTB, where an independent adjudicator will look at all the evidence and make a decision about your case. What if I switch suppliers? If you switch electricity supplier between 29 March 2022 and 30 June 2022, the supplier you were with on 29 March 2022 is responsible for giving you the credit.

A supplier can apply the credit to your closing bill or credit you back through the same method pay your bills.

If I don't get the credit: Suppliers will have information on their websites with the exact dates the credit will show on their customers' bills. Contact your electricity supplier if you have not received your credit by 30 June 2022. You can find the contact details for your electricity supplier on your most recent bill or statement

If there is a dispute: If you cannot resolve the issue with your supplier, you can contact the CRU's Customer Care Team for help. You can contact the CRU Customer Care Team on 1800 404 404 or email customercare@clu.ie.

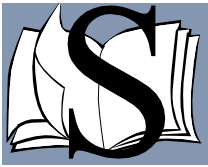

Students were asked to find an artist that they liked and a Primary Source. The idea behind the scheme of work was to show how an artist/style/movement can influence your work without plagiarism.



Grantas was fascinated by the work of Eiichiro Oda, a Japanese Artist who is a professional Mangaka. Oda is best known as the creator of the Manga 'One Piece'. The Primary source chosen was a photo Grantas took of his 1 yr old cocker Spaniel Kobe. Grantas produced a wonderful Artwork showing a magical influence of his chosen Artist and primary source photo that greatly impressed his fellow students and his art teacher Ms. Ryan.

Thirty Ninth Amendment of the Constitution (NEUTRALITY) Bill: This week People Before Profit submitted a bill on the issue of neutrality. The Bill seeks to explicitly insert Irish military neutrality into the constitution. This would ensure that Ireland constitutionally could not participate in any military conflict, unless there was a direct armed attack on the Irish State- subject to a vote of Dáil Éireann. In light of an ever-growing creep towards increased militarisation in the EU we see the passing of this Bill as a vitally important step to Ireland maintaining its status of military neutrality.

Health Committee- Neurological Alliance of Ireland: This week the Neurological Alliance of Ireland briefed members of the health committee on neurological services in Ireland. Currently, there are 24,000 people on the public waiting list for neurological outpatient care, 8600 of those people have been waiting for over 18 months.
