New Life in Springtime

On Easter Sunday morning it was raining at 6.00am as I stirred to go to the ecumenical sunrise service at the Hermitage golf club. Only prior commitment to other people motivated me from a horizontal position after a late night at the Easter vigil. The time change added to the pain. As always, it was worth the effort to start this new season of Easter, Spring and extended evening brightness watching the layered light and glowing colour rise in the east from a light veil of cloud and singing in praise to God.

Spring starts on 1 February according to the calendar of season, yet as nothing more than the brave snowdrops are willing to push their heads above ground along with the hardened furze (gorse, whin) flowers I prefer to see the real arrival on the last Sunday of March. The daffodils bring the colour of sunshine up from the ground while the arrival of lambs in shelter and on the hills announces a new cycle of life for the animal kingdom. Easter morning did feel like Spring as nature abounds with a freshness.

All new life depends on a letting go from another place of energy: the flower bulbs and corms feed the flowers and diminish in themselves; human and animal new life depends on taking nourishment from the resources of the mother; while the brightness of the season grows from diminishing darkness. In any life form, an older generation or form of being diminishes/dies to make space for the new generation. Darkness diminished on Easter morning to let the light shine through.



For those who bounce happily and unfettered into the new and beautiful season it is easy to bask happily. However, for those who arrive at this time having experienced a bereavement (seemingly untimely, perhaps) or carrying the weight of illness or struggling with a heavy responsibility, depression...the days can seem too long with no shade in which to hide!

In general, we move quickly along with little time taken to pause with one another. If we are to carry those who are struggling currently in our community, often quietly and with a strained smile, we need to take that extra moment to look one another in the eye and beyond the smiles. There is a depth in eye contact that is knowing for the giver and known to the recipient and can offer a place of acknowledgment, refuge or comfort. We, each, are the greatest source of light for one another bringing the ground level blooms and the sun poured light to merge in our encounters with one another. The most incidental of chance meetings can have the most profound effects if we are truly present in the moment and to one another.

For those alive with hope and energy may they be willing to share their store of energy, hope and light where needed in families, friendship groups, workplaces and local community. For those needing energy and hope may they be open to receiving from sources which are life giving for them currently. For all, may we trust that we may find a healthy equilibrium where new life and new hope may blossom for all when the time is right. It's OK to be OK and it's equally OK not to be OK! It's all part of the process of life. May new life grow in our community as we move in gentle companionship.

Public Holidays

There are 10 public holidays in Ireland each year (increased from 9 in 2022).

Public holidays may commemorate a special day or other event, for example, Saint Patrick's Day (17 March) or Christmas Day (25 December).

Since 2023, there has been a new annual public holiday in early February to mark St Brigid's Day. The public holiday is the first Monday in February, except where St Brigid's Day (1 February) happens to fall on a Friday, in which case Friday 1 February will be a public holiday.

On a public holiday, sometimes called a bank holiday, most businesses and schools close. Other services (for example, public transport) still operate but often have restricted schedules.

Good Friday is not a public holiday. While some schools and businesses close on that day, you have no automatic entitlement to time off work on that day.

Public holidays and your entitlements

Most employees are entitled to paid leave on public holidays. Full-time workers have immediate entitlement to benefit for public holidays and part-time workers have entitlement to benefit when they have worked a total of 40 hours in the previous 5 weeks. If you qualify for public holiday benefit, you are entitled to one of the follow

You can ask your employer at least 21 days before a public holiday, which of the alternatives will apply. If your employer does not respond at least 14 days before the public holiday, you are entitled to take the actual public holiday as a paid day off.

Your public holiday entitlements are set out in the Organisation of Working Time Act 1997. You can also read about the appropriate rate of daily pay in the Organisation of Working Time (Determination of Pay For Holidays) Regulations (SI 475/1997).

In the past few weeks, public telephone kiosks have been removed from villages and towns all over Ireland – there not being much demand for them anymore.



Above is Lucan's first telephone kiosk, just across the road from the demesne entrance beside the present AIB car park. There was another kiosk in the Post Office, but that was only available during business hours.



Who remembers putting pennies into the slot, then dialling the number, and pressing Button A when someone answered?

If there was no reply, you pressed Button B, and your money back dropped down into a return slot.

If you were overrunning your time, little beeps would sound, reminding you to put more money in.

A far cry from today's communications.

As most people did not have phones in their houses, they would not have had a directory either and would still need to find phone numbers – problem solved when a directory was left on a shelf in the phone kiosk!

As children, we all learned how to look up a number in this directory which was always in place. Nobody ever removed or vandalised it.

Different times!

Yet, my that very nature of uncertainty that creates turmoil it bespeaks of a dancehall in limbo land, where persons circulate in a meaningless movement, no side stepping, no minding the dresser, just a continuous tizzy of movement nudged unwittingly on and on waiting for that *soul-less* music to give you a break and let you get off the merry go round.

A Metro for Lucan

Lucan is on the verge of getting a Metro Dart rail line. After six weeks at an oral hearing with An

Board Pleanala for permission for an underground Metro Link, very little evidence was provided to justify such a costly undertaking with



so little benefit for all Dublin. By using a different rail gauge it can't link to main rail network, at a cost of about ten billion euro, over ten years to build, the unnecessary knocking down houses and apartments, major disruption, takes very few cars off the road and fails to address the main flaw in public transport the radial system all via the city centre.

Our option Metro Dart (Part of Newton Transport Plan) ticks all the boxes.

1. Uses standard rail gauge that links up the whole Irish rail network

2. It provides two rail lines from city centre to the Airport (vital for high usage areas) if one is out of order the other is available.

3. With Metro Dart all areas of Ireland that has a rail station has a direct access to the Airport, (with Metro Link Lucan users must go into city centre to get Airport link, changing twice).

4. No major disruptions or knocking houses or apartments.

5. Takes many more cars off the road.

6. At fraction of the cost (2 billion euro)7. Can be completed in half the time, less

than five years.

8. Takes users direct to many destinations.

It benefits areas around us, Clondalkin, Maynooth and Blanchardstown and all the rail stations along these rail lines. Metro Dart is a win win for everybody and for all areas. If they build the wrong rail gauge into Dublin Airport, we will never have direct access to Airport. An opportunity like this will never come again. It's worth fighting for. St. Mary's Camera Soirée

As I mentioned last week the subject for photography during the month of April is "windows". There have

been a few novel submissions. Michael G submitted a photograph of a phone box which he titled "54 windows" as there are 18 small window panes on each of the three side of the box. The box in question can be seen at the Salmon Leap in Leixlip.



He also submitted a photograph of stained-glass windows which he found in St. Patrick's Church in Newport, Co. Mayo. The window was commissioned in 1926 by the parish priest, who sold his life insurance policy to pay for it, from the great Irish stained glass artist Harry Clark. The window was not installed until 1931 a month after Clarke's death and only the right light was completed under Clarke's supervision.

Anna submitted a shop window taken at Merchant's Arch in Temple Bar.



Conor was in Farmleigh and gave us more spring blossoms, this time Magnolia blossoms. He also submitted stunning photos of a Snowy Owl, a Peregrine Falcon and a Golden Eagle. Most owls sleep during

the day and hunt at night, but the Snowy Owl is often active during the day, especially in the summertime. The Peregrine, which can be found nearly everywhere on Earth, is renowned for its speed. It can reach over 320 km/h (200 mph) during its characteristic hunting high-speed dive, making it the fastest member of the animal kingdom. The Golden Eagle is Ireland's second largest bird of prey. It was eradicated in Ireland in the 18th century but has been re-introduced into County Donegal to re-establish an Irish breeding population.
