An Advent tradition in Lucan

The Advent wreath is a symbol shared by many Christian traditions, its candles representing the four weeks of the Advent season leading up to Christmas. In Lucan, a tradition has developed where each of the four Christian Churches in the Village bring to each other a candle for the wreath bearing the name of their church. This candle is brought by a parishioner or minister and presented with greetings at Sunday worship. At the end of Advent the wreath burns a candle from all the churches in each church, a moving expression of shared faith.

O Come, all ye faithful!

One of our suspended Christmas traditions was our gathering on the Lucan Village Green on Christmas Eve. For many years past, members of the Lucan Churches of all traditions have gathered to read the Christmas story from the Scriptures and to celebrate it with Carols and song. It is one of those special occasions when denominational divides don't matter, and we gather to bear united witness to the reality that lies at the heart of all Christian faith – Jesus, the Word made flesh. This year we can gather again, and will be joined by the Lucan Concert Band who provide the music each year.

It offers us an opportunity for post-Covid thanksgiving, and we invite **all** to come and join in for Christmas 2022. We will gather at 1:00 pm on Christmas Eve and look forward to seeing many of you there. We will remember in a special way those who lost their lives during the pandemic and whose loss will be keenly felt at Christmas.

The blog post above is a good reminder that many of Lucan's buildings and sites appear to date from a certain period, but often contain far, far older parts or origins. Esker House (the original Esker Manor, where the Chinese Gospel Church is now based) is another such site that looks ostensibly like a Georgian farmhouse, but has much older 16th century components still extant, and is perhaps even older than this.

Esker House was the site of the Royal Manor of Esker dating back to King John's times in the early 13th century. A law court was held in this building where local legal cases were heard, presided over in the 16th century by the great-great-Grandfather of Patrick Sarsfield, Sir William Sarsfield. Sir William was an Elizabethan knight. Intriguingly, some historical records of this law court still survive and can be read here:

There's a lot of development and change in Lucan at present, and some of our historic buildings are: **Protected Structures** (SDCC enforces their protection)

Recent actions by SOL followers in the last 2 years have helped save a piece of historic wall along the old Esker Lucan-Newlands Road which has been incorporated into the new cemetery boundary, and saved Airlie House from destruction from fire, which has resulted in the loss of many old buildings around Lucan in the last few decades. Sadly, despite reporting the Farm Manager's house in St. Edmondsbury in good time, it was still destroyed by fire due to vandalism, so it is an example of how

ACRA Rail Failure

The extra train trips on the Lucan Adamstown line are very welcome. There are sufficient trains on this line for an hourly service all day to Grand Canal Dock via the city centre. Unfortunately, we are let down by the regulator NTA by not insisting the service is planned correctly.

There are sufficient trains, but there is no train serving Adamstown station to Grand Canal Dock from 2.35 PM until 19.00 PM, a gap of almost four and a half hours. During this time six trains pass through Adamstown to Grand Canal Dock without stopping, four of them start their inward trip from Hazelhatch station less than five minutes up the way. These trains have a stopover for more than ten minutes at the Hazelhatch station. Two other trains during this time start their inward trip from Newbridge and also stop at Hazelhatch but don't stop at Adamstown.

All these trains could depart two minutes earlier to allow them stop at Adamstown. This would give an hourly service all day through the city centre. Is Lucan been let down again or is the NTA asleep at the wheel with their strange decisions.


Despite the weather our members were out over the weekend taking photographs. There were more photographs of Christmas lights around Lucan.
