## The Door of Humility



The Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem stands over the place where tradition tells us that Christ was born.

One of the most striking features of the building is the doorway through which pilgrims must enter.

Great Cathedrals and Basilicas generally have massive doors, the doors of St. Peter's in Rome for example stand at over 7 metres tall. The Bethlehem door is tiny at just 1.3 metres and this means that every adult wishing to enter has to bend low,

there is no other entrance. Known as 'The Door of Humility' it is a powerful and symbolic reminder of the God who stooped down in order to take human flesh

and be born among us. Every person who has entered that sacred place through the centuries of its existence, from Kings and Prime Ministers to humble everyday folk, have bowed low; a fitting entrance to this sacred place.

In all the kafuffle of Christmas we can lose sight of the great wonder that lies at the heart of the feast. Christmas should leave us

gob-smacked, gob-smacked at the wonder of the reality of the 'Word made flesh', the Creator God who has reached out to us in the person of the babe of Bethlehem, the one who was later to declare "I came that you may have life, and have it to the full."

## Laying the Table

One of my earliest memories is of learning **to** *lay the table*. This was a daily ritual in our house, for the kitchen table was central to our family life. This ritual was a thrice daily occurrence, for it was laid for breakfast, dinner and tea. All of us children, 6 in total, were patiently shown how to set the table prior to meal times, while my mother was busy cooking our meal. This then became our duty; overseer was our Great Grand Aunt Anna Bridget (Smullen) Cosgrove, who

was an integral part of our family and household. Aunty Bee was how we youngsters addressed our great grand Aunt.

Let me firstly describe the kitchen table, it was a solid rectangular wooden table central to our family life. This was

where my mother did her preparatory work before cooking the dinner. Here she spread an old newspaper on the table to gather the potato and vegetable peels before cooking. Thus, our first job was to clean the table top before we spread the table cloth evenly over the smooth wooden surface. Next it was the plates and cutlery. We learned that the larger plates were for the adults and descended in size and order to a bowl and spoon for the youngest. Our Delph and cutlery were an assorted colourful lot, including one or two with the Willow pattern much loved by Mammy and Aunty Bee.

We had a rhyme to show us how to lay the table in order, we began at the head of the table and then turning to our left saying Daddy, Mammy, Aunty Bee, Imelda, Colette and little Marie-a (mé féin) adding Joseph, Veronica and Carmel as they arrived. I



should also mention that laying the table also included placing the chairs around the table. This again was an assorted collection including a piano stool and a bench where three could sit, here you had to be mindful that the person in the middle had to be seated first to steady it or else it tipped up, Ooops a daisy!!!

There was regularity about our meals which always began by saying Grace. Our meal was accompanied by a melodious chat, mostly about the news of the day or how school went; the phrase *has anyone anything strange or wonderful to tell us* started the conversation going. This practise is still replicated by my siblings and I in our own homes, as best we can.

Happy Days, Happy Times. Happier still at Christmas time, with the best table cloth adorning the table. The addition of TK Red Lemonade and Orange, Christmas Crackers and homemade Plum Pudding with custard or ice cream, meant we could truthfully proclaim our meal a Christmas feast. Yum, Yum.

Thinking back, I believe love and leading by example, are probably the greatest gifts we can pass to future generations. Christmas evokes many memories in our hearts, it evokes memories of times past when love and laughter lightened and enriched our days. A world we embraced with vigour, hope and trust.

Let our hearts this Christmas embrace all our loved ones, those past and present. Let each heartbeat pulse with love for our families, friends and neighbours.

Remember, as we silently hold the pain of missing loved ones, to celebrate having them within our hearts, never to be forgotten.

English: Mr. Sweetman's 6th Year English class, also accompanied by Ms. O'Brien, braved the elements last week to undertake a Patrick Kavanagh walking tour of Dublin. The group visited Kavanagh's former house on Pembroke Road, where he lived for 15 yrs and where he wrote a lot of his most beloved poetry. The highlight of the tour was a stroll down a leafy Raglan Road, (culminating in a bag of delicious Beshoffs!) while sitting on the various benches, commemorating Kavanagh, along the banks of the canal. Kavanagh famously found tremendous solace beside the Grand Canal and he often sat there contemplating his life. The bench with a bronze life-sized statue of Kavanagh sitting on one side, almost beckoning for someone to sit down beside him was inspired by Kavanagh's well known and much loved poem "Lines written on a Seat on the Grand Canal, Dublin". The purpose of the trip was twofold, as each student also disseminated Care Packs to homeless people, and other people in need, as they walked around the city. The idea for the care packs was prompted by the class studying the film "Rosie" as part of their Comparative Course, and each pack was paid for and packed personally (some even included personal notes and well wishes) by each student.

Mr. Sweetman, Ms. O'Brien, and the class group were very grateful to Paula and Gerry in McDonald's, Lucan Shopping Centre, for their generous donation and contribution of forty €5 vouchers, which ensured that every recipient of a care pack was able to get a hot meal on a very cold, wet, miserable day.

Gaeilge: As part of their extensive literacy and numeracy programme, The Irish Department are holding a monthly "beach-litriú" (spelling bee) to promote Irish literacy among the students. The 1st of these was held in room 2 last week. Nine talented 1<sup>st</sup> yr students had qualified for the final from a series of heats that were held in class. His model made such extremely complex material much easier to understand. Jack's science teacher Mr. Dunne was hugely impressed with the finished model while the principal Mr. Brady described it as one of the best projects he has ever seen in the school so high praise indeed. He is sure to get a very high mark anyway so well done to Jack on his fantastic work.

The Soiree had its final meeting for 2022 last Friday and will meet again in the Parish Centre on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2023.

This week the "back page" is devoted to the photographs Conor took of the city lights from the unique vantage point of his kayak on the River Liffey.

Perhaps the most interesting photo is that of the Diving Bell. According to the Dublin Port company website the Diving Bell was used in the building of the Port's quay walls from 1871 to 1958 and was a ground-breaking piece of engineering innovation in its day.





It was designed by the port engineer Bindon Blood Stoney. Among his other achievements were the building of the Boyne Viaduct in Drogheda, the construction of O'Connell Bridge, and the building of many of the Port's quay walls including Sir John Rogerson's Quay and North Wall Quay Extension.
