Love on 14 February 2024!

St Valentine is reputed to have healed the daughter of a noble family, bringing the family to believe in God. He was consequently executed. In later centuries, poets associate St Valentine with romantic love, so that we will see an abundance of cards, red roses, heart shaped chocolates, etc on Wednesday next. There may even be a few proposals of marriage!



This year, Ash Wednesday also falls on 14 February. How do the two celebrations fit together? One wouldn't choose to bring the two events together, but as they are, the common thread that could link them is love! Romantic love and great moments of consolation are hooks that bring people onto the road of love willingly and eagerly. Romantic moments are needed in life to rise out of the ordinary for a while to celebrate relationships or great milestones in life.

Ash Wednesday is concerned with the sacrificial aspect of love; where we are called to look at how we fail in love so that we may make amends, turning towards God as the model of perfect love. This is the love that is enduring and rooted. The sacrificial element of love is necessary to get through both the 'better or worse' times in marriages and life-long relationships that go the long distance. Acknowledgment of wrongs, a willingness to say sorry and to make consequent change is the hallmark of relationships that endure, built on a firm foundation of active as well as heartfelt love.

In terms of married love, there is no greater human witness to the Trinitarian love of God than is found in the selfless and other-focused love of couples in later years, and other stages in life, when they look after one another in the most vulnerable moments without any seeking of reward for self.



The cross of ash on our foreheads is a stark visual contrast to the brilliant red love-hearts of St Valentine's Day. The red, of the love-hearts is vibrant as the oxygenated blood that flows from our hearts keeping every limb and organ alive. The ash reminds us of the temporary nature of our lives while the cross reminds us of the sacrifice that is necessary in order to realise the hope in the resurrection. Love cannot be kept alive without making some deliberate effort or sacrifice in some aspect. The purpose of the call to make sacrifice, in the journey of love and

companionship is to change and become better people making the world a better place for everyone. We are on a journey in life and as with all journeys, we try to make the journey the best possible.

In Christian faith, Ash Wednesday is a happy day as it celebrates the sacrificial love of our God for us. We take the forty days of Lent as a gifted time when we focus on God's great love and intimate connection with us. We also accept Lent as a gifted time to grow more deeply in relationship with God, in love and acceptance of self and care and shared responsibility for others.

Thank God for the gift of love on 14 February 2024 and may that love grow abundantly!

Register to Vote

If you want to vote in an election or referendum in Ireland, you must be: Eligible to vote and Registered to vote



Changes to the registration system

You can now register to vote for the first time and update the register throughout the year. If you provide your PPS number, you do not need to have your identification and forms witnessed at a Garda station. Applications to register and to change the register can be made online at checktheregister.ie.

Registration dates to vote in March 2024 referendums

Two constitutional referendums on family and care will be held on 8 March 2024.

If you are not registered to vote and you want to vote in these referendums, you must apply to your local authority by:

12 February 2024 for Postal or Special Voting arrangements (see 'Postal Voters and Special Voters lists' below).

20 February 2024 to register to vote or to change your details on the register

How to register to vote

Each local authority is legally obliged to maintain, update and publish its Register of Electors. The Register must be maintained and updated on an ongoing basis.

To be eligible for inclusion in the Register of Electors, you must:

Be at least 18 years old

Be ordinarily resident at an address in Ireland

If you have no address, you can register with 'no fixed address.' You can give an address where you can get correspondence.

If you have more than one address, you should give the address where you want to be registered. You can only be registered at one address.

You can register to vote:

Online at checktheregister.ie
By filling in an application form
If you do not give a PPS number, you must get
your form and ID witnessed at a local Garda
station.

Deadline for registering to vote

Your application must be received by the local authority at least 15 days before an election or referendum (excluding Sundays, Good Friday and public holidays). If it is received on or after 14 days before an election or referendum is taking place, you will not be registered to vote in that election or referendum. More information on our website.

Changes to rental income under the Fair Deal Scheme

From 1 February 2024, the Fair Deal Scheme financial assessment will change if you are renting your home while you are in a nursing home. If you rent out your vacant home, you will be able to keep 100% of the rental income.

At present, if you rent your home, you must pay 40% of this rental income towards your nursing home care. This means you can keep 60% of the rental income of your own home. To apply for this currently, you fill in the Principal Private Residence Rental Income application form and supply your Residential Tenancies Board registration approval letter, the tenancy agreement showing the rental amount and your latest notice of assessment from Revenue.

If the property you are renting is not your own home, you must pay 80% of the rental income to nursing home care.

Hasan Al Maini (10), Daniel Godson (2), Troy O' Sullivan (2), Nabil Wan Modh (2), Conor Gilmore (2) and Omer Murwan Omer (2) got the scores for Lucan. Both teams have one more group match to play but at this stage they know that they will now compete in the Plate competition. Our u16 and u19 teams also failed to qualify from their tough groups but they went on to win their respective Plates in great style this season so our 1st and 2nd yrs can take heart from this.

Soccer: Our TY team advanced to the 3rd round of the TY Leinster Cup after defeating Scoil Mhuire, Clane 2-1 last Wednesday. Daniel Power scored the team's 1st goal after 25mins when he pounced on a loose ball in the box to fire home a precise right-foot shot from close range across the keeper into the far corner to give Lucan the lead. Maths: On Wednesday 24th January, 13 of our 1st yr students took part in the annual Irish Maths Teachers Association (IMTA) First Year Maths competition. These students were chosen due to their high results in the Christmas Exam. The competition was developed and organised by Michael Moynihan and has been running since 1994. It consists of 15 online multiple choice brain problem solving questions to be answered within a 40minute period. There were over 14.500 entries from 233 schools across the country. One student achieved 100% and a total of 63 students achieved over 84% and each one will be awarded an IMTA engraved trophy. The average score was just 34.6%. However, all of the Coláiste Phádraig students who took part achieved incredible results with all 13 achieving above 50% and one student, Ayman Ahmad, achieving over the 84% threshold. Ayman will now be awarded an engraved IMTA trophy for his excellent performance. All students received certificates for their hard work so well done to all.
