### **Lent – Springing Towards the Light!**

We have arrived in the season of Lent – the preparation period leading to Easter. We had the unusual coincidence of St Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday colliding this year. This is very rare as it takes a lot of numbers to stack up together for this to happen. Ash Wednesday is determined by the date of Easter Sunday. The date of Easter Sunday occurs on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring equinox – 20/21 March. The first full moon after the equinox this year occurs on 25 March so that Easter Sunday occurs on 31 March. Ash Wednesday occurs six weeks before Holy Thursday.

Regarding Lent, the liturgical cycle of the Church year leans into the symbolism of the natural seasonal and chronological year. The Church year fits well with the northern hemisphere, and in total contrast in the southern hemisphere. Lent is a time of reaching for spiritual growth while in nature it is the time when bulbs push up through the ground, buds sprout on branches and birds prepare nests in readiness for new chicks.

The growth which occurs in nature is dependent on the right conditions being provided. Water logged ground, rocky terrain and hungry or distressed animals will have less ability to produce new life. All hinges on having the right and appropriate space. The season of Spring is rich with the flourishing hope of producing colour, fruit, energy and a great freshness. This time of the year is a start in nature repeating a natural cycle in an ever-new way.

In parallel, we spend Lent reaching towards the great light and hope of Easter (the great promise that we will have a home with God for eternity), a time by which new natural growth will be burgeoning with enhanced photosynthesis as daylight hours extend. Our own ability for greater activity will increase correspondingly as we will be less likely to spend evenings in our houses. There is a natural, new energy growing in these weeks and a greater alertness to spiritual awakening.

Lent is an opportunity to fast (do without what we don't need), share with those in need, pray and reflect so that we, and all who inhabit the earth with us, may grow towards greater wholeness. It is an opportunity to consider how well we treat our own bodies so that we have best health, how we are with others and how we are with God. It is very much about realigning our lives to live our God-given potential more fully in good relationship with ourselves, others and God. The penance and repentance aspect is about making meaningful change by adjusting physical, spiritual and mental habits that hinder healthy spiritual, physical and mental growth.

To arrive ready for Easter we are called to

- recognise blocks in relationship and seek to mend them
- take an honest look at our lives to sweep away the grit and make space for new hope
- take a look at what priorities drive our family lives and consider if a new order needs to be formed
- treat the gift of the earth with greater respect as a fragile entity
- grow in deeper respect and understanding for the diversity of people, cultures and nature
- connect with our loving Creator God through prayer looking at our lives in the light of the Gospel

#### \*Referendums on family and care in 2024

When will the referendums be held and why? Two referendums will be held on 8 March 2024 for Irish citizens to decide if Article 41 of the Irish Constitution should be changed. Articles 40 to 44 of the Constitution set out certain fundamental rights people living in Ireland have.



A constitutional referendum gives Irish citizens the opportunity to decide whether or not the wording of the Constitution will change. There have been 38 constitutional referendums to date, and 32 of them have been approved.

What am I being asked to decide on?

You are being asked to vote on 2 referendums to change the Constitution. These changes are called the Family Amendment (the 39th Amendment) and the Care Amendment (the 40th Amendment).

The Family Amendment concerns the concept of family in the Constitution and deals with Articles 41.1.1° and 41.3.1°. In this amendment, there is one vote for 2 proposed changes – adding additional text to Article 41.1.1° and deleting text in Article 41.3.1°.

The Care Amendment concerns Articles 41.2.1° and 41.2.2° which deal with the role of women in the home. In this amendment, there is one vote for 2 proposed changes – deleting Articles 41.2.1°

and 41.2.2°, and inserting a new Article, 42B, which deals with care provided by family members.

You can read more about these proposed amendments on the Electoral Commission's website.

Can I vote in the referendum?

To vote in a referendum, you must be:

An Irish citizen At least 18 years old Registered to vote

You can check that you are registered to vote on checktheregister.ie. To vote in the referendum, you must be registered, or register any change of details, by 20 February 2024.

The deadline for postal and special voting arrangements passed on 12 February 2024.

Where do I vote and what do the ballot papers look like?

If you are registered to vote, your polling card with information on your polling station will be posted to you before polling day. The polling station will be open from 7am to 10pm. You need to bring a valid form of personal identification to your polling station.

The Family Amendment will be on a white coloured ballot paper. The Care Amendment will be on a green coloured ballot paper. You can read more about voting in a referendum.

\* Are you an Employee or self-employed? There is no special definition in the law that says who is an employee and who is self-employed.

How you do it

Written or verbal agreements between you and the business that pays you

Knowing whether you are an employee or a contractor is important because it affects taxes, social insurance (PRSI), social welfare and employment rights.







It is ironic that according to the OPW website as far back as the early 19th century proposals were drawn up to conceal the backs of the houses on Stephen Street as seen from the firstfloor windows of the State Apartments. The building known as the Coach House was, in part, intended to achieve this purpose but failed even then! Iit has to be said that over the years since 1922 there have been a few unsympathetic development within the castle grounds itself. The Strategic Framework Plan for Dublin Castle published in November 2022 will, hopefully, address some of these issues.
