Petition regarding the 25 and Hospital Bus: Thank you to those who have already collected signatures in their estates. St Brigid's day marks the start of Spring and hopefully milder weather, and we invite more volunteers to come forward when you can if you wish to play an active part. We are also currently seeking a meeting with Minister for Older People, Mary Butler, regarding accessibility of buses to older people.

Traffic flow in the village, potential to extend cycleway into St Catherine's, and Cllrs vote on the Village Green: Those living west of Woodies must be included in any new initiatives regarding access to public transport, walking and cycling. We are aware that SDCC have engaged KPMG to examine the potential for tourism in the county. We support extending the cycleway into St Catherine's which is the logical route. However, we in the LPC are mindful of local concerns about the Village Green that were brought up when we went round from door to door prior to the recent part8 public consultation.

We are seeking clarification from Cllrs regarding proposed works on the Village Green. We understand Cllrs were given two separate votes on the proposed changes. The public were not given this opportunity regarding changes to the Village Green. Objections were made in good faith to the parking proposals on the understanding if this did not go ahead neither would the Village Green changes. Splitting the part8 proposals invalidated the public consultation process in our view.

We have already met Lucan Traders to discuss options for traffic flow and our own proposal.

Embassy Wall update: I can confirm the following official update on the embassy wall "SDCC had appointed Roughan & O'Donovan to carry out the design of the new wall. The detailed design is now complete and is being reviewed by SDCC staff. 
