

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has \underline{a} history of over 100 years, in which Christians around the world have taken part in an octave of prayer for visible Christian unity.

By annually observing the WPCU, from 18 – 25 January, Christians move toward the fulfilment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that they all may be one." (*cf. John 17:21*) Texts are published by the Dicastery for

<u>Promoting Christian Unity</u> and the <u>World Council of Churches</u>, through the <u>WCC's Commission</u> on Faith and Order.

The theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in 2023 was selected by the Minnesota Council of Churches, USA in the aftermath of the extrajudicial killing of George Floyd and the trial of the police officer responsible for his death. These events brought anguish, but also time for the Christian communities to contemplate ways in which they may be complicit in racial injustice. Christian unity is needed as a source of reconciliation and unity.

The theme, taken from the first chapter of the Book of Isaiah, reflects his concern for the oppressed who suffer from injustice and inequality fed by hypocrisy that leads to disunity. He teaches that God requires righteousness and justice from all of us, to create the peace and unity that God desires. These virtues originate in God's love for all, and racism runs counter to this vision. Isaiah's challenge to do good and seek justice together applies equally to us today.

Here in Lucan, the annual service for Christian unity will this year be hosted by St. Andrew's Church of Ireland on **Monday**, **January 23**, at 8 p.m. We extend an invitation to members of all the denominations of Lucan to join together for this time of shared worship.

Fr. Ubaldo Muhindo, who is curate in both St. Mary's and St. Patricks parishes has been invited to preach at the service.

St. Andrews is this year celebrating 200 years since it's construction and we take the opportunity to congratulate Rev.Scott Peoples and his parishioners on this milestone in their history.

The Minimum wage

Generally, the amount of pay you get for working is agreed between you and your employer. Pay negotiations normally happen when you get a job offer. However, most employees are entitled to a minimum wage under the National Minimum Wage Act 2000. Since 1 January 2023, the national minimum wage is €11.30 per hour. Some people get sub-minimum rates, such as people aged under 20 (see the 'Rates' section on our website).

The national minimum wage does not stop an employer from offering you a higher wage. You cannot agree to be paid less than the minimum wage or to do unpaid work, unless you are employed by a close family relative or are on a recognised apprenticeship.

Different rates of pay for certain sectors

Employees in certain sectors, such as the security sector and the cleaning sector, have other minimum rates of pay. The rules for these sectors are set out in Employment Regulation Orders (EROs) made by Joint Labour Committees. You can find out more in our page, Employment agreements and orders.



Tax Credit

What is the Rent Tax Credit?

A tax credit reduces your tax by the amount of the credit.

A new Rent Tax Credit was introduced on 15 December 2022.



How much is the Rent Tax Credit?

The amount of the credit is 20% of your rent payments in the year, up to a maximum credit of:

€500 for an individual

€1,000 for a couple who are jointly assessed for tax

Can I claim the Rent Tax Credit?

You can claim the credit for rent payments you have made for:

Your home

A second home that you use to take part in an approved course or your work

A property that is used by your child to take part in an approved course, if they are under 23 at the start of their first year

An approved course means a course that is eligible for tax relief on third-level fees.

Registration of tenancy

Your tenancy must be registered with the Residential Tenancy Board, unless it is a type of tenancy where this is not required, called a licence arrangement. This includes where you are sharing with the owner in a rent-a-room or digs arrangement.

In some cases, only the types tenancies that must be registered with the Residential Tenancy Board are eligible for the credit. This applies if:

You are related to your landlord or

You are claiming for a property that is used by your child

Exclusions

The tax credit does not apply to payments for:

A security deposit

Repairs or maintenance

Board, laundry or other services

Your landlord must not be:

A housing association or approved housing body

A local authority

Your parent

Your child

For a property that is used by your child to attend a course, the landlord cannot be any relation to you or your child.

You cannot claim the credit if you are getting housing support including:

The Housing Assistance Payment

Rent Supplement

The Rental Accommodation Scheme

Cost rental housing

How to claim the Rent Tax Credit

You can claim the tax credit for rent paid in 2022 in myAccount: Sign in to myAccount, Go to the 'PAYE Services' section, Click 'Review your Tax 2019–2022' and select 2022, Click 'Request' under the 'Statement of Liability' section, Scroll down to 'Complete your Income Tax Return', Click 'Rent Tax Credit' and complete the requested information.

You can claim the tax credit in 2023 using Revenue's Real-Time Credit facility.

Greetings from Nepal,

Hope all is well with one and all, deep into midwinter. The last 9 months or so was a busy time for Nagarhope Basic School, as we constructed a 5 roomed earthquake proof Pre-Primary block in Sathikurya.

To date about €58,000 has been spent on construction costs, half of that from the Provincial Government in Nepal, the other half from donations from your good selves, the people of Ireland and beyond. The new facility will be used for the youngest 4 classes, about 70 children between the ages of 2 and 5. Furniture- tables, desks, benches, whiteboards, carpet and painting, are still to be fitted.

Nagarhope Basic School now accommodates for 130 children in total, with 12 staff and a handful of volunteers also giving time on a regular basis. Currently, we are running a 5 day football camp for 20/30 children, teaching them how to shoot, dribble, pass and save. The mornings are cold here but the afternoons are delightful 'til about 3pm, so long as the sun comes out.

After a 2 year hiatus due to the pandemic, fundraising in Ireland has picked up again. A very successful table quiz was held in Lucan HQ, Aka Sarsfields at the tail end of '22, where close to 40 tables battled it out for bragging rights.

And not too far around the corner, another fundraiser is taking place in Lucan SPA hotel. Elvis and the Way it was orchestra featuring Kevin Doyle are supporting this good cause. They've done a few gigs for Nagarhope now, for that we'd like to extend our thanks to the group.



St. Mary's Giving Tree -Thank You!

Greetings and Blessings to all and wishing you all a very Blessed Year.

The People of the Leprosy Colony of Malou, South Sudan, would like to Thank You all most sincerely for your kindness and support to them this year, through the Giving Tree Collection. The people I work with are the most vulnerable I have ever met in my time in Africa. Most of the 4900 people I work with are aged and extremely weak. Most of them do not have hands, feet, fingers, toes and are ravaged by constant sickness and disease. The people of the leper colony have suffered a life time of suffering because of the nature of their disease and inability to provide for themselves or work, and in South Sudan it is only the fittest that survive. But I feel very blessed to know these wonderful, kind, special and loving people who I consider to be a huge part of my

It is extremely hard to provide food and medicine for so many people, and this past year in particular has been extremely difficult. I currently have little to no support for the people, but your contribution will go a long way to providing Maize, Beans, Salt, Oil and some goats which could see them through for 1 meal a day for 4 months.

I do not know how to tell each and every one of you how grateful I am for your kindness, support and compassion towards them. 




in Waterford. The team were proposing the motion "Sustainable Development Goals are a waste of time". They were fantastic as usual and we eagerly await the results.
