Some months ago, St. Mary's Parish held a Volunteering Sunday.




A member of the Pastoral Council spoke at all the Masses one week-end and threw out a general invitation to the congregation. This invitation was an invitation to be part of one of the many ministry groups that make up the parish infrastructure. That day proved a great success and we added several people to most of the ministry groups.

A similar exercise is about to be conducted in St. Patrick's Parish.

On Saturday / Sunday 28th/29th a member of the Pastoral Council will speak at each of the weekend Masses with a similar invitation addressed to the whole parish community.

In St. Patricks, there are a variety of active groups and ministries offering a diversity of areas in which parishioners can become involved. New blood in ministry groups is essential if a parish is to continue to bloom and grow. Ministry groups should ideally reflect the composition of the parish; they should have a gender balance, a diversity of ages and they should reflect the diverse ethnicity of our community. We especially welcome those from the new areas of the parish. For each of the groups some training and preparation will be provided and the extent of the commitment clearly explained. An information leaflet on each of the ministries will be available in the main porch. You are invited to take one or more of these home, and to give the matter some thought. If you then feel ready and willing to join one of the ministry groups you can complete the form on the back of the leaflet and return it on the following weekend, February 4th and 5th February. A box will be provided in the main porch for the forms.

Perhaps you have never had any involvement in the past, this could be your opportunity to change that. You *can choose from many ministries e.g.* Reading the Word of God at Mass, administering the Blessed Sacrament at Mass and to the housebound, preparing families for the baptism of their children, working with the bereaved at their time of loss in preparing the funeral liturgy, join a church cleaning group etc. etc. There really is something for everybody.

From 1 February 2023, the price of a standard domestic postage stamp will increase from &1.25 to &1.35. There will be no increase in the price of a standard international stamp (&2.20) or the Digital Stamp (&2.00).

What is Fuel Allowance?

Fuel Allowance is a means tested payment to help with the cost of heating your home during the winter months. It is paid to only one person in a household.

The Fuel Allowance season normally begins in late September of each year and ends in April. This year's Fuel Allowance season started on Monday, 26 September 2022. It will be paid for 28 weeks (until 10 April 2023).

The current rate of Fuel Allowance is €33 per week. You can choose to get the Fuel Allowance paid every week or paid in 2 instalments (lump sums).

To get Fuel Allowance you must:

Live alone (or only with certain people listed on our website)

Be getting a qualifying payment (unless you are 70 or over)

Satisfy a means test

These 3 conditions are explained in detail on our website along with comprehensive information on the Fuel Allowance.

You must also live in Ireland. You cannot get Fuel Allowance if your heating costs are provided in full as part of your accommodation.

Fuel Allowance income limit for people over 70

You should read how your income is assessed before reading this section.

You can have income of up to €500 per week, or €1000 per week for a couple and still qualify for Fuel Allowance.

Your capital (savings, property and investments) are also assessed. The first €50,000 of your capital is not included in the means test. Note that if one person in a couple is aged over 70, you will be assessed for Fuel Allowance using the over-70 means test criteria.

Fuel Allowance income limit for people under 70

If you are under 70, you must be getting a qualifying payment to apply for Fuel Allowance (see 'Qualifying social welfare payments and pensions' on our website).

To qualify for Fuel Allowance, your total means from all sources must be less than the current maximum rate of State Pension (Contributory) including any increases that you might get for living alone and dependants, plus €200. This is called the assessable income limit.

From January 2023

The assessable income limit for a single person is \in 465.30 (\in 200 plus \in 265.30).

The assessable income limit for a couple (where the qualified adult is aged under 66) is ϵ 642 (ϵ 200 plus ϵ 265.30 plus ϵ 176.70).

The assessable income limit for a couple (where the qualified adult is aged 66 or over and under 70) is $\[\epsilon 703.10 \]$ ($\[\epsilon 200 \]$ plus $\[\epsilon 265.30 \]$ plus $\[\epsilon 237.80 \]$.

If one person in a couple is over 70, the over-70 means test is used so the assessable income limit is \in 1.000.

Rate of Fuel Allowance

The current weekly rate of Fuel Allowance is €33.

You can get your Fuel Allowance paid weekly or in 2 lump sum instalments.




Junior Girls Basketball

Soccer: Hard luck to our senior soccer team who were beaten 3-2 by Castleknock Community College in the Dublin Metropolitan League Regional semi-final last Thursday. Tyler Doherty gave Lucan the lead with a powerful header from close range mid-way through the 1st half. An unfortunate own goal levelled the scores before half-time. In the 2nd half, Castleknock went 3-1 up before Tyler grabbed his 2nd of the game with a drilled finish from the edge of the box. Lucan pushed hard for an equaliser but Castleknock were resolute held on for the win.

Our u15 team advanced to the Dublin West League semi-final after defeating Holy Family Rathcoole 2-0 last Friday. Sam Deegan opened the scoring in the 1st half with a crisp close range finish. Ben Lawless scored Lucan's 2nd goal after a typical clinical right-footed finish across the keeper into the far post. Lucan were rarely troubled in defence and they eased to victory in fine style.

They were out again in action on Tuesday when they faced Palmerstown CS for a place in the Leinster Minor Cup 3rd rnd. Unfortunately, a physically imposing Palmerstown team scored three set-piece goals in a 3-1 victory to knock Lucan out. Lucan fought hard throughout and created plenty of opportunities against a deep lying defence but they came up just short on the day. Cillian Murphy scored the team's only goal as he curled the ball around the keeper into the bottom right hand corner.

Football: Hard luck to our u16 football team who were beaten 6-16 to 2-11 by Scoil Chaitríona in their final group game of the Dublin Junior Football League on Tuesday. Scoil Chaitríona hit a hot streak in the 1st half scoring 3 unanswered goals in quick succession to open up a commanding lead that in truth they rarely looked like relinquishing. Shane Wallace had a fine game for Lucan as he scored 8 points while Michael O' Brien and Reece Kelly scored the team's goals. The team finished with 3 points in the group stages (after 1 win from 3) which was not enough to secure a place in the knockout stages of the competition.

Basketball: Our 1st and 2nd yr basketball teams began their Eastern League campaigns last Friday with the 1st of their respective group stage matches against Drimnagh Castle. It proved to be a day of contrasting fortunes with our 1st yrs losing 21-3 while our 2nd yrs won 35-18 in impressive style. Hasan Al Mani scored Lucan's only three points against strong opponents and

our 1st yrs will have learned a lot from their first match together with three more matches to play. Our 2nd yrs, coached by TY student Alseny Bah, produced a dominant display to ease to victory in their match. The team opened up a 9-2 lead by the end of the 1st 1-4 with thanks to some impressive baskets from Lucan's influential point guard Lewis Adjinakou, Cian Kelly and Aaron McCormack, who excelled with rebounds. They moved 23-8 clear by the end of the 3rd 1-4 and continued to control the game in the final 1-4, with Jack Horan and Jack O' Dwyer impressing late on with some nice baskets.

Religion: As part of Catholic Schools week, a poster competition was held based on the theme "Walking together in faith and love". There was a huge number of high quality posters submitted and after serious consideration by the judges, the winner was 1st yr Aaron Jobin, who's creative, colourful and artistic representation of the theme impressed everyone. 
