Congratulations to former Lucan South Priest

On Tuesday last it was announced in the Pro-Cathedral, that Pope Francis has appointed Fr. Donal Roche as Auxiliary Bishop of Dublin. Fr. Donal is well known in these parts having served in Divine Mercy Parish for over seven years from 2005 to 2012. Donal is a native of Mourne Rd parish in Drimnagh and has, since his ordination in 1986, served in a variety of appointments from School teaching to parish priest. He is well remembered in Divine Mercy, where his relaxed easygoing manner endeared him to many people. He is fluent Irish speaker and was called on for many years by the local Irish Schools for the big sacramental occasions. He left Divine

Mercy to serve the following 11 years in Wicklow town until last summer, when he was transferred to the Cabinteely-Foxrock partnership of parishes.

He takes up his new role at a time of great transition and change in the Dublin Diocese, and will doubtlessly be a great support to Archbishop Farrell in meeting the unique challenges being posed by the rapidly changing circumstances that we find ourselves in. His variety of pastoral experience will doubtlessly be of great benefit.

We wish Fr. Donal every blessing in his new role and we look forward to welcoming him back to Lucan for a visit after his Episcopal Ordination. A date for the ordination has not yet been announced.

MABS – the Money Advice and Budgeting Service is the State's money advice service, guiding people through dealing with problem debt for over 20 years. MABS phone service is open Monday to Friday 9 am to 8 pm on 0818 07 2000

The State Pension (Contributory) is paid to people from the age of 66 who have enough (PRSI) contributions. It is sometimes called the old-age pension. The State Pension (Contributory) is not means tested. You can have other income and still get it.

As the social insurance (PRSI) conditions are very complex, you should apply for a State Pension (Contributory) if you have ever worked in Ireland and have paid PRSI contributions (stamps) at any time.

If you retire early, make sure that you continue paying PRSI contributions or that you are getting credited contributions (if you are eligible). This can help you get a contributory pension when you reach pension age.

Qualifying age for State pensions The minimum qualifying age for all State pensions is 66.

You can choose to defer claiming your State Pension (Contributory) up to age 70.*

Invalidity Pension

If you are getting an Invalidity Pension, you can transfer to the State Pension (Contributory) at the full rate at age 66.

Payment for people who retire at 65 If you retire at 65, you may qualify for a benefit payment until you reach 66. To qualify for this payment at 65, you must have stopped working and meet the (PRSI) social insurance conditions.

Changes from January 2024

Changes to the age you can claim a pension, long-term carers contributions and how your pension is calculated have been introduced in January 2024.

Age you can claim*

From 1 January 2024, you can claim your pension anytime between the ages of 66 and 70. Your PRSI contributions from work, between age 66 and your pension claim, can be used to help you qualify or get a higher rate of State Pension (Contributory).

Long-term carers

From January 2024, if you have cared for someone for 20 years (1040 weeks) or more, you may get a Long-Term Carers Contribution on your PRSI record for each week that you provided full-time care. These contributions can only be used to help you qualify for the State Pension (Contributory). The person you are caring for must have a disability requiring full-time care.

Calculating pensions

From January 2025, there will be a 10-year transition to using only the Total Contributions Approach (TCA).

Brexit and your pension

On 31 January 2020 the UK exited the EU. However, you will still get your Irish State Pension (Contributory) or UK State Pension, as before. Irish and UK citizens living in Ireland can still benefit from social insurance contributions made when working in the UK.

To qualify for a State Pension (Contributory) you must be aged 66 or over and have enough Class A, E, F, G, H, N or S social insurance contributions (PRSI). These are also called full-rate PRSI contributions.

You need to:

Have paid PRSI contributions before a certain age Have a certain number of paid PRSI contributions Have a certain yearly average number of PRSI contributions since you first started to pay PRSI (this is the average rule) OR have a certain total number of PRSI contributions (this is the Total Contributions Approach).

Apply for your social insurance record You can request a copy of contribution statement through MyWelfare.ie. To do this, you need your PPS (Personal Public Service) number.

Niall Ryan Doyle continued his sensational form in the Lucan goal with three saves in the penalty shootout. They will next face Scoil Mhuire, Clane at home for a place in the semi-finals.

Careers: 37 of our 6th yrs students braved the horrendous weather conditions last Friday to attend a campus tour of UCD. The students met with Ms. Hunt and Mr. Todd on campus before beginning their tour with an Admissions presentation in the Gerard Manley Hopkins Centre. The group were then taken on a 60 min tour of the spacious campus where they got to see the James Joyce Library, the O' Brien Science Centre with its sleek, state-of-the-art science labs, the Sutherland Law School, the enormous Sports Centre with its impressive facilities (including a fantastic Sports Hall, gym and swimming pool), the huge number of pitches for different sports, the School of Business, the Engineering and Materials Science centre, the very modern Arts and Humanities building, the Earth Sciences centre with its enormous tiered, lecture halls as well as the beautiful woodland gardens and beautiful lakes. The students even got the chance to have an impromptu snow-fight on campus! Our 6th yrs thoroughly enjoyed the tour and they are to be commended on their maturity (snow-fighting aside!), attentiveness and exemplary behaviour throughout.

Music: On Monday 4th March, our music club visited the Irish Rock "n" Roll Museum in Temple Bar. The museum gave students the opportunity to tour a working recording studio and rehearsal space. Complete with state-of-theart Neve desk (one of the most iconic mixing desks in existence) along with other professional equipment, this was an opportunity not usually available to the public. Students got to learn the history of the famous musicians who have passed through the halls and discovered exclusive memorabilia from the likes of U2, Thin Lizzy, Sinead O Connor and many more. Among their

favourite finds were Michael Jackson's pyiamas (worn while recording some of his last songs in Westmeath) and Phil Lynott's school report card. The highlight of the trip for everybody was the highly anticipated Jam Room, which was set up with a full drum kit and a guitar and bass hooked up to professional Marshall Amps. The lads enjoyed playing music together and got to explore each instrument and would have staved there all day! The tour guide was amazed at the students' musical knowledge and loved their interaction and passion for music. The music theme continued after the museum as students visited music stores to play even more instruments and others visited record shops and added to their record collection. The whole day was a very immersive and rewarding experience for the students.

Coding: During EU Coding Week, our 1st and 2nd Year Coding classes took part in the Bebras Computing Challenge. This challenge introduced computational thinking to students, by allowing them to solve interactive tasks online. It is run in over 60 countries and took place back in November. The aim of Bebras is to get students all over the world excited about computing. In this an international problem solving competition, students had 40 minutes to answer 15 puzzles. 

I am convinced that one of the group circulated a photograph of an old P&T public telephone kiosk during the week but for the life of me I cannot

find it just at the moment. This put me in mind that it was recently reported that *Eir* has begun the process of removing the last of the country's pay phone boxes. The first payphone appeared about 100 years ago and at their peak there were around 3,300 such phones in the country. The younger generation will not believe that in the early days many villages around Ireland did not have an automatic telephone service and that in these locations the majority of telephone subscribers did not have 24 hour service. After 10pm each evening in general the only phone that worked round the clock was the manually operated public telephone kiosk in the village square. The last manual telephone exchange in Ireland was at Mountshannon, County Clare and closed on 28th May 1987.
