Once again, Lucan is gearing up for another St. Patrick's Day Parade, and welcomes Sorcha Furlong as our 2023 Parade Marshall. Sorcha will be known to many as Orla Molloy of RTE's *Fair City*.

The Lucan Parade is a free day out for families, and is run by a group of a non-profit, volunteer lead, organization, funded by a Community Grant from South Dublin County Council, donations from Lucan Traders, and various fundraising events held during the year.

Assembly & Starting Times

The Parade will assemble and commence at the large green located at Green Park Road / Westbrook Park / Hillcrest Close in Hillcrest (adjacent to Tesco) **from 2pm**, be in place by 2:30pm. *See running order on page 8*.

The Parade commences at 3pm sharp and proceeds down Dodsboro Road, under the N4 bridge onto the Leixlip Road, past McDonalds, onwards towards The Ball Alley Pub, and into Lucan Village, turning left at Courtneys, past the review stand located outside the Muintir na Tire hall, and disperses up through the village past the Italian Embassy. The parade takes two hours approximately to complete the route.

MABS – the Money Advice and Budgeting

Service is the State's money advice service, guiding people through dealing with problem debt for over 20 years. MABS phone service is open Monday to Friday 9 am to 8 pm on 0818 07 2000.

Paying your Electricity Bills

When you sign up to an electricity supplier, you should get regular and accurate bills. Suppliers must give you a range of options for paying your bills. Recent increases in energy costs have had a big impact on the cost of living for households. If you are worried about paying your electricity bills, help is available. You can contact your energy supplier to explore payment options or contact MABS for help and advice.

Public Service Obligation (PSO) Payment: The 'Public Service Obligation (PSO) levy' is paid by all electricity customers to support the costs of renewable energy. Since energy prices have increased in the past year, the levy is not needed to support renewable generators.

As a result, all domestic electricity customers will get a refund of $\in 89.10$ on their electricity bills. The refund will be paid in 7 payments of $\in 12.73$ from 1 March 2023.

You will get the refund either on your bill or your prepay meter. For prepay meters, the PSO payment will be deducted from the daily electricity standing charge by your electricity supplier.

Help with rising electricity bills: Domestic electricity customers, including pay as you go customers will get 600 to help reduce electricity bills. The credit is paid in 3 instalments of 200. The first payment was made from November 2022. The second electricity credit will be made from January 2023. The third will be made from March 2023.

Other measures to reduce electricity costs

Changes to VAT rate

Since 1 May 2022, the rate of VAT on gas and electricity bills reduced from 13.5% to 9%. This reduced rate is in place until 31 October 2023.

If you are struggling to pay your bills: Help is available if you are worried about paying your electricity bills.

You can:

Make an appointment for free confidential advice with the Money Advice and Budgeting Service (MABS)

Contact your supplier to discuss payment options Contact your local Citizens Information Service Your electricity supply could be cut off if you do not pay your bills. MABS has more advice if you have problems paying your bills.

Customers who have problems paying their bills cannot be disconnected during the winter months (for 2022/2023 winter period, this runs from 1 October to 31 March).

Alternative Payments Plans: The supplier can agree to put an alternative payment plan in place for you. Suppliers must help you if you are in genuine financial difficulty. They must make at least 4 attempts to contact you before they disconnect your electricity.

Understanding your Bill: It can sometimes be difficult to understand the bill, particularly how the amount you owe is calculated.

Your supplier must include information about how it has calculated your bill. This includes the meter reading the bill is based on, the tariff category that applies and any levies that are being applied to the bill.

A bill is usually sent by your electricity supplier every 2 months. It must be clearly marked whether the meter read used to calculate your bill amount was:

A – an actual meter read by ESBN

C - a read submitted by you the customer

E – an estimated meter reading

Check your bill to make sure you are not getting too many estimated bills in a row as this could result in a large bill when an actual reading is taken. You can check your meter and submit your own reading at any time to make sure you are getting accurate bills. ESBN has information about how to submit an electricity meter reading. Suppliers must give you a range of options for paying your bills (for example, by direct debit, paying online with your card or pay at shops displaying the Payzone logo). Contact your supplier to find out what option suits you.



Dear Editor,

For over 15 years we have sent €500 each month from Lucan to a school in poverty-stricken Haiti.

The money is used to build, furnish and supply educational materials. Each day a hot nutritious meal is served from their newly-built kitchen to 500 students and staff. To date we have sent over \$150,000. Each member of our group has signed a bankers' order for a sum of money which is guaranteed for a number of years. This ensures that the school can rely on a budget planned in advance. Our account is in Bank of Ireland, Lucan, and it is from that account that our money is sent every month. All the money goes directly to the school and in the 15 years not a single penny has been deducted for costs or expenses.

Now my work is done. Due to age and health reasons I can no longer administer the fund. So, I must appeal for some individual or group to take over. Haiti is one of the poorest places on earth. Since we became involved, it has suffered tow enormous earthquakes, storms, political unrest, violence and poverty. Women and children are the main victims. A hungry child cannot learn and in a lot of cases can't even go to school. Our work is small but vitally important. Please help,

Annual Report of St. Mary's Parish Pastoral Council 2022

Following the COVID 19 break a new Parish Pastoral Council was established in 2022. The new Council members were; Fr. Philip Curran, Fr. Tom Kennedy (Left September), Yvonne O'Shea, John Gormley, Sr. Geraldine Smith, Sr. Julie Carmody, Maria O'Mahony, Niall Kelly, Colette Toomey, Christopher Okereke (Left September), Mark Beegan, Bernie Martin, Jimmy Miller and Marie Peelo, Fr Ubaldo Muhindo (Joined September).

The Commissioning of the new Council took place on 6th February at the 10.30am Mass. Members of the Council spoke at all Masses that day to explain what the Parish Pastoral Council does. The Council met six times during 2022 on:

14th January, 16th February, 16th March, 18th May, 28th September, 7th November.

The first priority of the Council was to re-establish the normal workings of the Parish both in terms of the sacramental life and the caring and outreach responsibilities derived from the Gospel, after the disruption caused by COVID-19. A special thank you was extended by the PPC to Colette & Michael Grant for their musical contributions to the Masses during the Covid lockdowns.

The Novena of Grace was held this year in St. Marys from 4th March to 12th March. The preacher was Fr. John Walsh O.P.

There were two significant projects undertaken by the Council in 2022. The first was the Synodal Pathway and the second was Building Hope.

The Synodal Pathway: This is a universal process inaugurated by Pope Francis. It is a path or journey that the People of God take together in every Parish in the world. Pope Francis called on us all to participate in discerning how best to make synodality a vibrant force for transformation in the church.

St. Marys Parish appointed two animators Elizabeth Boland and Mary Toole who facilitated the discussion at Parish level and liaised with and reported back to the Diocese.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament re-commenced on Sunday on 6th February, 2022 from 4pm to 5pm, to pray for the success of the Synod in Rome in 2024.

Elizabeth & Mary spoke at each of the Masses on the weekend of 27th February, 2022 and explain the concept to parishioners. Invitations to participate were extended to parishioners who attend St. Marys and to non-attendees.

Two open meetings of the Parish took place on 21st & 28th March which were led by Elizabeth & Mary. The purpose of the meetings was to get input from the faithful regarding our Church today and how we can journey together in growing our faith and participation more fully. At each evening two questions were posed to the people present. Views were written down and collated by the team.

The St Mary's Parish Synod Report was submitted to the Diocese in June and the overall Irish report was published and sent to the Vatican in September. We pray for and look forward to the results from the Synod in Rome whenever it is scheduled.

Building Hope: The Building Hope initiative from the Archdiocese sought the views of parishioners in Dublin around managing the life of the Church in the context of smaller congregations and fewer admissions to the Priesthood. The report from the 'Building Hope' initiative in St. Marys was submitted to the Archdiocese and forms part of the overall report will can be viewed on the Dublin Diocesan website.

Partly as a result of the outcome of this discussion Mr Philip Curran was made Parish Priest of both St Mary's and St Patrick's. Fr Tom Kennedy left Lucan to take up a role as Parish Priest in Castledermot (Co. Kildare) and we welcomed Fr Ubaldo Muhindo to St Mary's from Divine Mercy (Lucan South). Christopher Okereke our Lay Parish Worker also left to take up a role in Finglas Parish.

Volunteers: The PPC organised a 'Thanks Giving' Mass for past and present Volunteer Groups within the Parish, on Sunday 6th November 2022. Volunteers past and present gathered in the Coffee Dock following the Mass.

An Open Day for Volunteer Groups was held on 27th November 2022 after all Masses. This event allowed parish groups to explain their work and also look for new members. One of the groups which requires new members is the Justice & Peace Group.

Faith Development and Youth Ministry: There were several discussions and suggestions for involving teenagers and young adults to be more involved in the Parish.

There was discussion regarding the complexities of organising Religion Classes for the Non-Catholic Schools in the parishes and how best to prepare Children for the sacraments.

The need to increase the level of Adult Faith Formation in the context of reduced numbers of clergy and increased involvement of the laity in the parish was considered.

Conclusion: Overall given that this was the first year back after the lock-down and disruption of COVID-19 much was achieved, through the Grace of God. By the end of the year it was calculated that congregation in Church were back to 70% of the pre-Covid level compared to roughly 50% at the start of the year. With the initiative that were put in place in 2022 we can look forward to further strengthening of the Parish in the coming years. A special note of gratitude and best wishes for the future is expended to Fr Tom Kennedy and Christopher Okereke for their years of service to the Parish. The PPC would also like to thank the Parish Team under the Leadership of Fr. Curran and all volunteers involved in the life of the Parish.

Emmanuel Choir: Well done to our students who took part in the Emmanuel choir concert in the Helix on Thursday night. You were fantastic.








