# Spring Light



This weekend our clocks go forward an hour which will mean the return of lovely long spring evenings. There's something about spring evenings that draw us out of our homes and many will use the opportunity to enjoy evening walks. Given the lovely parks we have in Lucan we have no excuse not to take advantage of the blessings of nature. Combined with the extra hour of daylight, the return of

colour to the gardens, signs of new life all around us, this makes for a lovely time of year.

Just as nature is awakening to new growth we will celebrate the great feast of Easter on Sunday April 9<sup>th</sup>. Sunday next April 2<sup>nd</sup> is Passion or Palm Sunday and marks the beginning of Holy Week, that sacred week when we recall the final days of the Lord's earthly life.

On Passion Sunday we will hear the story of Christ's passion and death from the Gospel of Matthew. This sets the tone for the days that follow especially Holy Thursday and Good Friday.

On Holy Thursday the priests of the diocese will gather with Archbishop Dermot in the Pro-Cathedral for the Chrism Mass; this is the only morning Mass celebrated in the Diocese that day. At this Mass the holy oils for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Sacrament of the Sick are blessed and distributed, and the priests will renew their commitment to priestly service. On Holy Thursday night each parish will celebrate the Solemn Mass of the Lord's Supper recalling the night on which Jesus instituted the Eucharist, at which he washed his disciples' feet as an example of love and service.

In Lucan on Good Friday, the four churches unite in a common act of public walking together with prayer and song following the Cross. This begins in St. Mary's at 12.00 noon and proceeds down the hill to the Methodist church, then on to the Presbyterian Church and concluding in St. Andrew's Church of Ireland. We invite all Christians to join us on this very special occasion.

On Good Friday at 3pm we gather for the solemn celebration of the Passion, this includes the veneration of the cross and the reception of Holy Communion. We gather again in the evening to pray the Stations of the Cross.

The culmination of Holy Week is the celebration of the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. This celebration invites us to a renewal of baptismal commitment and rejoices in Christ's victory over sin and death.

Holy Week is an invitation to enter into the great mystery of Christ's love for us.

#### SCAMS and FRAUD www.fraudsmart.ie

FraudSMART, the fraud awareness initiative led by Banking & Payments Federation Ireland (BPFI), is warning consumers of a rise in serious investment scams that are highly convincing, appear to be legitimate, but are in the fact the work of fraudsters. Brochures using the names and branding of well-recognised, legitimate bonds and investment schemes are being circulated by fraudsters and advertised online. The fraudsters hide behind websites, including product comparison websites, which appear to be legitimate and also make contact via cold calling, unsolicited emails, social media and text messages.

Initial indications suggest that the scams are particularly targeted at those in the over 55 age bracket with a minimum investment of  $\notin 20,000$ and in many cases upwards of that. While the amounts may seem high it's important to point out that the victims are not necessarily wealthy customers, but often people on low to average incomes who have worked hard all their lives to build up a pension and are at a stage where they are looking for a last opportunity to top up their finances ahead of retirement. In one reported incident an older customer was about to invest  $\in$ 60,000 from their pension into what appeared to be a legitimate scheme. Fortunately, the customer made a call directly to their bank before pushing the payment through and this meant that the fraud was identified and averted.



### Letter to Councillors

#### Dear Councillors O'Brien, Casserly, Gogarty, O'Toole, Ó Bradaigh and Tuffy,



I would like to draw your attention to a situation which I have been concerned about for some time. So much so that the problem has now become, in my view, a very difficult and hazardous situation for pedestrians.

On Millstream Road (at the junction with Woodview Heights, Dodsboro Road) heading down towards the R835 it has become almost impossible to walk down on either side without the risk of slipping on the pavement due to wet fallen leaves and debris from the surrounding trees and shrubbery.

Over the years the falling debris from the trees and shrubbery on the footpath has never been cleared, so it has just piled up. When the grass on the verge is cut, the excess grass is never cleared up! With the result, the pavement is narrowing in places, and, leaving little more than about 2 feet of footpath left to walk on. And this too can be covered in leaves and other organic material. During wet or icy weather, when left to pile up, it can be lethal to walk down the hill.

As I'm sure you are all aware, when these fallen leaves/debris and organic material become wet, or have started to decay, it can create obscure slips on the ground. These risks occur in two ways, they hide any hazard that may be on the path i.e., pavement cracks, potholes etc., or they themselves create a slip risk to the public possibly causing serious injury.

I believe that it is the duty of South Dublin County Council to see to it that these fallen leaves and debris do not become harmful to anyone using the footpath on Millstream Road. It needs a radical clean up. And kept that way. SDCC website states "Ensuring that rubbish and other debris such as leaves and grit are removed from the pavement"

As a 68 yr. old pensioner with Osteoporosis living in the area I dread to think what could happen should I be that unfortunate person who slips and falls on the pavement on Millstream Road.

Might I suggest you take a walk down and see for yourself? It really does need attention.

I look forward to and wait in anticipation of your comments and feedback via the Lucan Newsletter.

## St. Mary's Camera Soirée

Donal demonstrated his prowess in controlling the shutter speed of his camera by submitting photos of fast-moving trains on the railway track alongside the bank of the Royal Canal.

Construction of the Royal Canal began in 1790. Twenty-seven years later, in 1817, it reached the Shannon River. The Duke of Leinster, a board member, insisted that the new waterway take in his local town of Maynooth. This demand meant that the builders had

to deviate from the planned route and necessitated the construction of a 'deep sinking' between Blanchardstown and Clonsilla. A "sinking: is a section of a canal which is cut through the land to maintain the same level so there's no need to use locks. In the "deep sinking" of the Royal Canal the towpath is up to 9 meters above the water. The diversion also called for the building of the Ryewater Aqueduct, at Leixlip. The Royal Canal was built in direct competition with the Grand Canal.
