Agency agreements, trusts, and ordinary powers of attorney

There may be many reasons why you are unable to deal with your affairs. For example, you may be physically unable to collect your pension or you may acquire an illness or disability that limits your ability to make decisions. If you become incapable of dealing with your affairs, there are various legal arrangements you can make to have someone else do these things on your behalf.

The choice of legal arrangements open to you depends on your precise circumstances. Some of the arrangements are very simple to make and have limited effect, for example, appointing an agent to collect your social welfare payment. Others are much more complex and require the help of legal and medical professionals, for example, executing an enduring power of attorney. It is advisable to take legal advice before entering into the more complex arrangements.

Assisted Decision-Making (Capacity) Act 2015

The Assisted Decision-Making (Capacity) Act 2015 creates new decision-making arrangements to help people make decisions about their welfare and their property and affairs. This assistance and support is required where the person lacks, or may lack, the capacity to make the decision unaided.

The new arrangements include decision making assistance and co-decision-making and a process is

also set out for a court to appoint a decision-making representative for an individual.

As well as introducing new decision-making procedures, the Act sets out new arrangements for wards of court and for people who wish to make an enduring power of attorney.

The Decision Support Service has been set up to provide a range of functions when the new arrangements come into effect.

Agency arrangements

If you appoint another person to represent you in certain dealings with third parties, you are making an agency arrangement. You are called the principal and the person you appoint is called the agent or appointed representative. The most usual example is where a pensioner nominates someone to collect social welfare pension payments or other allowances from the post office.

Another example of an agency arrangement is where you appoint a friend or family member as an agent to manage your financial affairs or pay bills while you are abroad for a period. You may appoint a professional to do these things and pay for the service – this is not an agency arrangement but is a contract for services.

If you are physically incapacitated, your bank may allow you to carry out a third-party mandate. This authorises your agent to perform certain functions, for example, to write cheques on your behalf.

You may only make an agency arrangement while you are mentally competent and the arrangement usually only lasts while you remain mentally competent. The arrangement does not have to be in writing unless the agent is required to sell property on your behalf. It is advisable to put the arrangement in writing so that both you and the agent are clear about what is intended and what powers the agent has.

Agency arrangements for social welfare payments

The Department of Social Protection (DSP) has the power under social welfare legislation to make payments to a third party acting on behalf of a social welfare recipient. The legal status of a social welfare agency relationship is different from the general agency relationship in that the social welfare agency may be put in place or may continue in operation if you become mentally incapable.

If an agent is appointed to collect the money, it is still your money and there is a legal duty on the agent to use it on your behalf and for your benefit. The DSP may end the agency arrangement at any time where it has reason to believe that the arrangement is not working satisfactorily.



Basketball: Congratulations to our 2nd yr basketball team who advanced to the All-Ireland Junior Boys "B" Final after defeating St. Pat's Grammar School, Armagh 31-26 in their semifinal, held at the Oblate Centre in Inchicore last Wednesday. Lucan led 11-4 after the 1st 1-4 thanks to 9 points from Aaron McCormack and a basket from Páidí Murphy. St. Pat's reduced the deficit in the 2nd quarter thanks to three 3 pointers but they still trailed 13-11 with Ciarán O' Sullivan scoring Lucan's only basket in this period.

Lewis Adjinakou scored 7 crucial points in the 3rd 1-4 with Cian Kelly also scoring a basket as Lucan led 20-17 at the end of the 3rd 1-4. The final 1-4 was a tense affair but Lucan held their nerve to win by 5 points thanks to further scores by Lewis (5), Aaron (2) and Cian Kelly (4) to secure their 10th win from 10 this campaign. The team will now face Le Chéile, Tyrellstown in the All-Ireland Final in the National Basketball Arena, Tallaght.

Economics: Congratulations to 5th yrs Calum Conway, Cian Carr, Tabib Haque, and Mobashir Ahadmanish for placing 2nd overall for all 5th year projects in the Young Economist of The Year Awards Ceremony held in UCD on Friday. They also all received a gold medal for their work. Their project looked at De-Globalisation and the exploitation of resources in developing nations, and it will be available for students to view on the Economics and Business board outside of Mr. Geraghty's office. Judges were very complimentary of the depth of their work and their ability to structure a research project. Notably it was the only project which did not focus on the Irish economy to win an award, so well done to all of the lads involved.

Hurling: Our 2nd yr hurling team cruised into the Dublin League "C" semi-finals after an emphatic 16:20 to 1:05 victory over St. David's CBS Artane last Thursday. It was a dominant display of hurling from our 2nd yrs and they didn't ease off at any stage despite the massive gulf in class and experience. Henry Greene excelled for Lucan with an impressive haul of 5-02, Cian Kelly added 4-01, James Duffy scored 3-0, Brian Whelan got 2-02 with further goals and points being scored by Ciarán O' Sullivan, Páidí Murphy, Derry Ware, Morgan Gladney, Jack Henry and Seán McGillicuddy.



The medical card means testing on income has not changed for many years, except for changes to over 70s card or free GP care for under 6 years of age. However, the list of expenses considered in means testing for a medical card is limited and does not reflect many costs of living expenses and the real net income of a household. In circumstances were persons have a medical condition, we need to be sure that patients are not facing undue hardship and those who need a medical card are receiving a card. My office meets patients whose real net income is not considered to qualify them for a medical card due to the limited means testing system, but because their illness is not terminal, they don't receive a discretionary medical card.


St. Mary's Camera Soirée
