The Unjustifiable and Obscene Suffering in War!

I was touched when I watched the news one night and saw a grief-stricken father holding the wrapped rigid body of his seven-year old son in his arms wondering how this could have happened to one so innocent. The boy was killed when the refugee camp was bombed, a supposed place of safety and protection. The father's words were 'what has this seven-year old boy done to deserve this'. We also saw a father crying with consolation when the body of his dead daughter was found as the prospect of being captured was far worse. The equivalent of an average primary school cohort of children is being killed in the Gaza strip each day since the war begun. The defilement of children, the beating of elderly women, the torture of those who are captured and the menacing incitement of fear and terror in innocent people are not tactics of a war that can be in any way be considered just or right.

The unrepentant attitude and abhorrent self-righteousness of the perpetrators, on both sides, is strident and impenetrable. The directive provided by Israeli leaders warned the Gaza residents that they needed to evacuate within twenty-four hours to a safe area in the south, a time and a reality that was logistically impossible and inhumane in expectation. The consequence of bombing residential areas, refugee camps, hospitals, etc. is nothing short of a targeted genocide built on a foundational drive to seek revenge. The wrongs of Hamas cannot be corrected by wrongs of similar and aggressive nature. Pain, grief and despair feels the same regardless of the nationality, colour, creed or age of the people concerned. Two horrendous wrongs cannot bring about what is right and justice.

My inclination in recent times has been to want to limit the amount of news that I see or hear as it can all seem too much to take in and deal with on top of our own day-to-day responsibilities. However, this war, and other wars currently in progress, are not in abstract from our own lives and responsibilities. This alerts me to an encounter which I had with Tomi Reichenthal some years ago (a Holocaust survivor living in Dublin). Tomi speaks publicly in an effort to try to prevent further mass atrocities occurring in the world which are caused by a particular cohort of perpetrators and are allowed to persist by those who remain silent while our human brothers and sisters suffer. Therefore, it becomes all the more important for us to feel the pain of those who are suffering and to intentionally inform ourselves so that we may build some power of influence through those who can act on our part in the political and diplomatic realms.

What is the Humanitarian Assistance Scheme?

The Humanitarian Assistance Scheme is an income-tested scheme that provides emergency financial assistance to households affected by a severe weather event such as flooding. It is administered by the Community Welfare Service.

The scheme provides financial support to people who have suffered damage to their home. It is designed to help you meet the cost of essential needs and repairs rather than provide full compensation for losses or damage.

What does the Humanitarian Assistance Scheme cover?

The scheme covers:

Emergency income support payments Damage to your home and its essential contents, such as carpets, flooring, furniture, household appliances and bedding

Structural damage

The scheme is usually only available to help people who have been impacted by a severe weather event, but the Department of Social Protection can extend it to cover other exceptional circumstances at their discretion.

What does the scheme not cover?

The scheme does not cover:

Losses covered by an insurance policy Loss of items deemed to be not essential or luxury items

Commercial and business losses Loss or damage to private rented accommodation or local authority accommodation

How do I qualify for help under the scheme?

Your household's income is assessed to determine your household's ability to meet the costs of restoring your home to a habitable condition. All household income will be considered in the income test. You do not have to be getting a social welfare payment to qualify.

Information on the income test is on our website.

If you have no insurance

If you had no insurance and you do not have reasonable grounds for not having insurance: You will be expected to contribute the first €2,000 toward the amount allowable, and Your personal contribution will be 2% for each whole €1,000 above the appropriate income level for your household

How much can I get under the scheme?

How much is paid under the scheme depends on how severe the damage is and your ability to meet these costs.

How do I apply for the scheme?

To apply for the Humanitarian Assistance Scheme, you should complete the Humanitarian Assistance Scheme application form (pdf). You can also get the form from your local Community Welfare Service or from your local Intreo centre or branch office.

You must include the following with your application, where available:

Evidence of household income (pay slips, etc) Estimates for repairs or replacement

A copy of your insurance policy

Paid invoices/receipts

Any other information which may support your claim

You should send your completed application form to the Community Welfare Officer (CWO) at your local Community Welfare Service.

Concerns Regarding the Vantage Towers Mast in Lucan


I am writing to express my profound disappointment in the recent decision by South Dublin County Council to grant permission for Vantage Towers to erect a 21-meter high mast on the grounds of the Penny Hill Pub in Lucan. The majority of residents, including myself, only found out about the proposal when it was too late to object.

It is disheartening to witness a decision of this magnitude being made without due consideration for the impact it will have on our local environment. I wholeheartedly support the call for our local representatives to appeal this decision. As a resident of Lucan, it is my belief that such a proposal would not be approved in more affluent areas, further deepening the sense of inequality and discrimination faced by our community.

The main beneficiaries of this decision seem to be Vodafone and the owners of the Penny Hill Pub, while the local community is left to bear the brunt of the consequences. The imposition of a 21-meter high mast on our landscape will undoubtedly have a significant and negative impact on the visual aesthetics of the area. It is crucial that the Council takes into account the importance of preserving the character and beauty of Lucan, which we all cherish.

Furthermore, the recent pool fiasco in Lucan has left many of us with the impression that the South Dublin County Council is showing a lack of interest in our community. The series of disappointments and seemingly hasty decisions reflect a disregard for the concerns and aspirations of Lucan residents. It is high time that the Council re-evaluates its approach and gives our town the attention it deserves.





LUCAN HARRIERS A.C. Dublin 2023 Race Report

Lucan Harriers had nearly 40 runners in the Dublin Marathon this year with many taking part in their first marathon and all performed admirably. The day started off with the annual clock change. The weather on the morning started off bright with blue skies. The crowds gathered in Fitzwilliam Square and surrounds from 7.30 as the last-minute nerves kicked in, the runners trying to keep warm on the crisp morning. Jumping, stretching, leg swings, swivels all types of movement just to keep warm. The nice weather didn't last as the rain didn't take long to materialise and many people were wet before the event even kicked off. It started in 4 waves, 5 including wheelchairs. 8.40 for the wheelchair athletes, 8.45 runners and then every 20 minutes until 9.45. 8.45 on the nose, the National Played and DCM 2023 was on its way with over 22000 athletes of all ability registered to be at the start line.

The route takes the runners through many notable Dublin Sights. Stephens Green, St Patricks Cathedral, Phoenix Park, many city suburbs, Manor St, Castleknock, Ballyfermot, Crumlin, Walkinstown, Terenure, Rathgar, Clonskeagh, Milltown, UCD, Nutley Lane, Merrion Road, Ballsbridgeand onto the finish line in Merrion Square only a short walk from the starting point. It is recognised as been a tough course. As the hours went on the weather got worse with many large puddles enroute, the finish line couldn't come soon enough for many. The athletes were soaked and the crowds on the sidelines were soaked. The euphoria of running in the last few hundred metres onto the purple finishing mat should never be underestimated. The finishing line can be quite an emotional place with many people overcoming so many personal challenges to get to the start line, get through the course and get across that finishing line. Just crossing that finish line irrespective of how you got there or the time you finish is an incredible achievement and one to be extremely proud of, a once in a lifetime achievement for many

Well done to club stalwart Winifred Ryan for organising the club stewarding. We also had 35 Lucan Harriers stewards lining the course from

Mount Sackville Gate in the Phoenix Park all the way to the top of Sarsfield Road in Ballyfermot. All wrapped up nicely in Marathon Colours. Without the support of stewards from various clubs this event simply couldn't take place, well done everyone for getting out there and supporting the athletes. Many other Lucan Harriers were at the bag drop area in Merrion Square and at various locations around the course cheering their friends and clubmates on. There is nothing nicer on the marathon course then getting a cheer from the sideline when you are least expecting it. First Harriers across the line were Ryan Rafter in 2.55.43 and Kathleen Trunk 3.34.24. Eileen O Brien came home 3rd in her category and Josie Dignam 3rd in the Dublin Championship.
