On the Threshold of the Year's End

This Sunday is the last of the current church year, the feast of Christ the King. The year ends so that we may start a new year in Advent rolling into the depths of the darkest days of winter until Christmas after the winter equinox on December 22. The chronological new year is close at hand also; a time for letting go and for new beginnings. We need to let go of the old in order to have space for the new life.

In Sunday's Gospel we hear of what is necessary in order to bring about the values of the kingdom of God on earth: feed the hungry, cloth the naked, visit the prisoners, welcome the stranger and provide water to the thirsty. We see the needs expressed in the Gospel reflected in today's reality as we look in on disasters throughout the world where people suffer abjectly because of war and strife. Needs are evident in our own country for those are homeless, those who are prisoners of addiction and poverty, those who often feel unwelcome because of some difference and those who thirst for justice and basic rights.



Every word, action and attitude has some impact as we are all agents of freedom or imprisonment, sharing or hoarding, welcoming or excluding, preserving or destroying as bearers of light or darkness. We are beckoned towards light while enfolded in the darkness of current season. As the darkness currently increases, we know that light will follow in the new year. The best vantage point from which to see light is from the background of darkness with the sparkling light of the stars in the dark blueness of the sky as a perfect example.

Each day is an opportunity to bring about a little heaven on earth for ourselves and one another through expressed values that are enduring and lasting. We will be enveloped by material advertising and aggressive promotion in the next few weeks with pressures brought to bear on many for whom life is already a challenge. For those who are in a good space right now may they mindfully share light and for those who feel like they are in darkness now may they look towards a source of light, lean on others and walk in hope trusting that day always follows night. Taking on the challenge of the Gospel, and that of empathy with our brothers and sisters on life's journey, may we lift unnecessary burdens from the shoulders of those in need so that a beam of hope may light their path.

General guidelines for buying safe products for children

A toy is a product intended for children aged under 14 to play with. Equipment children use (such as sports equipment) that are not toys come under the General Product Safety Directive.

Toys that meet national and EU safety rules should:

Be strong and resilient (should not break easily) Be made of materials that do not burn easily Be made of non-toxic materials Carry the CE mark

A child's product that contains detachable or small parts should be marked as unsuitable for children under 36 months. Bikes and go-karts should have adequate brakes and guards for chains and other moving parts. Bikes used on public roads should have certain lighting fitted as standard.

In-store credit

Some shops offer the option to buy an item and pay for it in instalments. This is sometimes called Buy Now Pay Later – BNPL.

When you buy goods or services from a business, there may be an option to Buy Now Pay Later. This may be provided by a different business that is a credit provider. You enter into an agreement

to repay the credit provider. It is important to check the terms and conditions of the agreement, including the fees and charges such as interest or late payment fees. The CCPC has further information on Buy Now Pay Later, including the "pros and cons"

What is the Christmas Bonus?

The Christmas Bonus is an extra payment for people getting a long-term social welfare payment.

A Christmas Bonus of 100% will be paid in the week beginning 4 December 2023 to people getting a qualifying social welfare payment - details on our website.

You do not need to apply for the Bonus, if you qualify you'll automatically get it.

The Bonus is normally paid with your social welfare payment.

Once-off double week in January 2024 A once-off double week for all weekly qualifying social welfare payments will be paid in the week beginning 29 January 2024. Payments that qualify for the Christmas Bonus will qualify for the once-off double week.

Who gets a Christmas Bonus?

A Christmas Bonus is paid to people getting longterm social welfare payments.

A full list of the qualifying payments is available on our website.

Fuel Allowance is not a qualifying payment for the Christmas Bonus.

How much is the Christmas Bonus?

In 2023, the Christmas Bonus is 100% of your normal weekly payment (including the Living Alone Increase, the Island Allowance and the Over-80 Increase).

If an Increase for a Qualified Adult is paid directly to your dependent spouse, civil partner or cohabitant, the Christmas Bonus is also paid directly to them.

If you are getting 2 eligible social welfare payments (for example, a One-Parent Family Payment and the Domiciliary Care Allowance or a half-rate Carer's Allowance as well as your primary payment) you will get the Christmas Bonus for both payments.

For Domiciliary Care Allowance (DCA), which is paid monthly, the bonus is 100% of the weekly DCA rate. The DCA portion of the bonus is calculated independently of other payments.



and Jamaica. The event was held over two days,
Friday 17th and Saturday 18th November. The
event is run entirely by students, under the
guidance of Rathdown's MUN Director.
There were 19 schools attending the conference,
representing almost 50 countries. The students
took part in a role-playing activity that simulates
the real work of the United Nations. Each country
had a member in each of the different committees,
such as E&E (Energy and Environment), H&Y
(Health and Youth) etc.

During committee session, resolutions were put forward on how to resolve the committee's respective issues, the resolutions were debated, amendments were submitted, and the resolutions were finally voted on. Alex D'Alba, representing Australia in ECOFIN, put forward a resolution that very nearly passed, but unfortunately fell short by two votes.

After committee, the general assembly was held, in which all countries debated a number of the resolutions that passed.

Our Club members attended the Awards Ceremony on Saturday evening but they missed out as the vastly more experienced schools claimed the top awards. However, our students thoroughly enjoyed their participation at RADMUN and everyone learned a lot from it. They are all looking forward to the next conference in February.

Athletics: Well done to 2nd yr Conor Abbot who qualified to be on the Dublin Cross Country team at the u14 All Ireland Championships in Gowran, Co. Kilkenny at the weekend. The Dublin Team won both County and Provincial Gold medals at this prestigious event and Conor also won an individual medal by finishing in 11th place in a time of 11mins 17secs (in a strong field of 161 top class competitors.)

Science: As part of our Science Week celebrations last week, Maynooth University hosted an online Zoom masterclass in Astrophysics and Cosmology for our senior classes. Our students showed great interest and submitted interesting and intelligent questions for the Q & A session afterwards. It was also a great opportunity for our students to get some valuable information on the Physics Courses in Maynooth and also hear about student life on campus. The masterclass was part of the school's Science Week celebrations. Our TY students ran a science table quiz for 1st and 2nd yrs and they did a great job organising and conducting the quiz.




