The Church is not a museum for saints but a hospital for sinners

We had a family wedding earlier this year and I was delighted to celebrate the wedding and assist the bride and groom in organising the ceremony. They went to a great deal of effort to plan readings, prayers of the faithful, flowers and all other aspects of the ceremony as well as making sure that as many of their friends as possible were involved. They also organised a very enjoyable wedding reception which had a great focus on attention to detail.

I thought of this when reading today's Gospel. The King had similarly put in a great effort to have an elaborate wedding for his son but, to his dismay, many people who were invited did not turn up. So, what does he do? Go ahead without them? No, he decides to invite people from the highways and byways who would not normally be included on the guest list. And so, it is for the church. Many of the Jewish people chose not to accept Jesus's invitation, so he them goes and extends it to others, and let's remember that we are their descendants.

Who do we invite to the wedding feast? Who are the people who are currently outside of our Christian community that we might like to include? Perhaps young people, young families and those who are excluded and marginalised.

We should ask how we can reach out individually and collectively as a parish community. Sometimes we think that great strategies are needed but often all that is needed is a simple personal invitation. We need to be a welcoming, inclusive, and friendly community who respond to the heartbeat of the Gospel just as the wedding guests did in our Gospel reading today.

Pope Francis once described the church as not a museum for saints but a hospital for sinners. I think this is the point that Jesus wants to make in our reading today. Let us pray in the coming week that we will be open to God's invitation in the different circumstances of our lives and that we will be able to respond to it.

BUDGET 2024

Budget 2024 was announced on Tuesday, 10 October 2023. The Budget sets out an overall package of \in 12.3 billion. This is made up of a package of once-off measures worth \in 2.3 billion, a core budget package of \in 5.2 billion (\in 4.3 billion current and \in 0.9 billion capital expenditure) and non-core expenditure of \in 4.5 billion for 2024 (plus \in 0.3 billion in additional capital funded from windfall receipts).

Our website has information on the main changes in taxation, cost of living supports, supports for energy costs, social welfare, health, housing, education, employment and other areas. It is an overview and not a complete statement of all the measures announced in Budget 2024.

Some of the changes announced in the Budget come into effect immediately or before the end of 2023. Others take effect from the beginning of January 2024 or later in 2024. Many others have to be finalised before coming into effect. Some

elements of these measures may change when the legislation required to bring them into effect is enacted.

Once-off payments in winter 2023

Once-off payment of €300 to people getting Fuel Allowance (November 2023)

Once-off payment of €400 to people getting the Working Family Payment (November 2023)

Double payment of Child Benefit for each child (December 2023)

Once-off payment of €100 to people who get an increase for a qualified child (one payment per qualified child)

Once-off payment of €200 to people getting the Living Alone Increase

Once-off payment of €400 to people getting Disability Allowance, Invalidity Pension, Blind Pension, Carer's Support Grant and Domiciliary Care Allowance in November 2023, (you will get one payment only, even if you qualify for more than one of these payments or you are caring for more than one person).

Christmas Bonus

A Christmas Bonus of 100% will be paid in early December 2023 to people getting a qualifying social welfare payment.

Social welfare weekly payments

The maximum rate of all weekly social welfare payments will increase by €12 with proportional increases for qualified adults and people on reduced rates of payment (January 2024).

The weekly rate for a qualified child will increase by \in 4. It will increase from \in 42 to \in 46, for children under 12 years of age. It will increase from \in 50 to \in 54 for children aged 12 years and over (January 2024).

A once-off double week for all weekly qualifying social welfare payments will be paid in January 2024.

Universal Social Charge

The reduced rate of USC for medical card holders is being extended until 31 December 2025. Reduced rates of USC apply to people who have a full medical card whose income is €60,000 or less a year.

Carbon tax

Carbon tax will increase by €7.50 per tonne of carbon dioxide emitted, from €48.50 to €56.00. This applies from 11 October 2023 for auto fuels. The increase will apply to all other fuels from 1 May 2024.





Open Night: There was a fantastic turnout for Coláiste Phádraig's Open Night last Thursday 5th October, with well over 700 parents/guardians and prospective students in attendance on the night. They got to meet the staff and teachers, visit the classrooms and check out the fantastic array of modern, state-of-the-art facilities that the young students may soon get to enjoy.

A big attraction on the night was the new school building which was officially opened in a lovely ceremony held at 6pm in the new school library. It was attended by lots of special guests, including past-pupils and former teachers, management and admin staff of the school, parents, current students, members of ERST (Edmund Rice Schools Trust) as well as our recently retired principal Mr. Brady. The new building will allow us to cater for the huge demand for places in the school and help alleviate the pressure on families seeking secondary school places in the Lucan area.



The building was given a special blessing by Fr. Ubaldo (from St. Mary's Church, Lucan) before the ceremony of the official opening of the new building took place. There were 7 different coloured ribbons in-keeping with the theme of the occasion which was "Partnership and Inclusion". 1st vrs Cian McCarty and Adeolu Adebomi cut the 1st two ribbons. Mr. Emerson, a former pupil and current teacher, cut the 3rd. Mrs. Nwoke, a parent of two current pupils, cut the fourth while Ms. O' Leary cut the 5th. Rose Martin, former longserving secretary in the school and a current member of our Board of Management, cut the 6th while Gerry Berry from ERST cut the final ribbon and declared the new building officially open. There was plenty of food and refreshments for all afterwards, served by our wonderful Parents Association. There was no time to mingle for too long though as the Open Night began at 7pm with the car-park almost full by this time already!

The parents and children were very hugely impressed with the airy, spacious, modern classrooms and the fabulous library that has been stocked with hundreds of new books in different languages (to cater for the diverse nature of our student population). A large number of our current students were also in attendance for our Open Night and they proved to be excellent ambassadors for the school as they spent time engaging the primary school students in the different subject areas and made sure they felt welcomed and valued.

English: All 6th yr Higher Level English students attended a poetry workshop in the school library last Tuesday with award winning Clondalkin poet Colm Keegan. One of his most engaging poems is entitled "Ireland is..." where he describes his experience of living in Dublin in the modern age. He opened the workshop by getting the students to compose their own Ireland is... poems and he got some really interesting and well-written responses from our lads. The students then moved on to develop their own poetry and some very bravely offered to read the poems out in front of the group. Colm was really impressed by the students' honesty, skill, creativity and passion for writing.

Football: Our 2nd yr football team won their opening Dublin League group match 7-09 to 5-06 against Kingswood CC last Wednesday. Max Campbell and Jack McCarty scored two goals apiece while Aaron Wall, Daniel Godson and Hugh O' Neill each scored a goal to help Lucan to a deserved victory.

Our senior footballers were beaten 4-16 to 1-06 by Ballymahon, Longford on Monday in their 2nd and final Leinster League group match. Tyler Doherty scored the Lucan goal with Luke McGovern (0-3), Michael O' Brien (0-2) and Killian Costello (0-1) getting the other scores. The team have now been eliminated from the competition but they still have the Dublin League to compete in.

Tidy Towns Competition Results 2023

The results of the National Tidy Towns Competition 2023 were announced last Friday. Two of our members attended the event which took place in Croke Park. Abbeyleix is this year's overall winner with a score of 376 marks. So how did we in Lucan fare? Well we achieved 354 marks which was an increase of 12 marks on last year. Once again we were awarded a bronze medal.

We were very pleased with the detailed report which we received which indicated that the adjudicator/s had really spent time in and around our village. The comments were constructive and informative. There were many positive comments which we thought warranted an even higher score than we achieved. We are in the process of analysing the results, going through the report in detail. We will then work on a plan for 2024.

Here are some of the adjudicator's comments: We are delighted to welcome the hardworking tidy towns committee from Lucan to the 2023 competition. It is pleasing to see that the 5 members on your committee are assisted by the further 15 volunteers but noting that Lucan is a large town, a higher level of engagement might be expected. Consider going on a recruitment drive as bigger numbers of committee members and volunteers would enable you to tackle both a greater range of projects. It is great to see that there is a junior tidy towns group in Lucan and that local TY students regularly get involved in planting and other projects. Consider delegating responsibility for the monitoring and maintenance of some of your projects to them as this will enable you to spread your workload and to foster ownership of your projects to younger age groups in your area.

It was a pleasure to visit Lucan and see its many attractions that include its riverside location, fascinating heritage buildings and attractive open spaces. Aside from the magnificent single span Liffey bridge, there were lots of fine examples to be seen in your urban village centre with the Muintir na Tire Building, the Methodist Church, the School Masters House, the Garda Station, the Presbyterian Church all catching our eye.

We would also like to compliment the many shops and local buildings in Lucan – all of whom appeared to have made notable efforts to ensure that their buildings looked their best for adjudication. Unfortunately, it is not possible to list all good examples, but a number stood out and they include; Courtneys (with its distinctive thatched roof), Dublin Formal Wear, Ryan Village Café, Sabbatinis, the River Café, the

Lucan District Credit Union, Seasons on the Weir Restaurant, the Artisan Pantry, Fresh & Juicy, Femme Fatale and Power & Smullen.

Given that there is such an abundance of high quality heritage structures and buildings in your area, we agree wholeheartedly with the suggestion in the 2022 adjudicators report that a heritage trail should be developed as a means of raising awareness of them among local residents and visitors. Perhaps you could advise us next year if this is under consideration?

Our visit revealed that there are many high quality landscaping schemes in Lucan and the work on entrance planting on approach roads is particularly impressive. The landscaping on the eastern approach (i.e. coming past the Hospital) was a highlight of our visit. We enjoyed seeing the entrance planting at the welcome stone here with shrubs, montbretia and verbena. The long shrubbery bed beside St Edmundsbury Hospital looked lovely and we admired the wonderful variety of plants that a mix of shrubs, orpine, wallflowers, loosestrife, lavender, hydrangea and common daisies.

The extensive shrubbery bed opposite Ballydowd Grove looked great with its roses, hebe, shrubs, orpine and red claw while the large planted bed opposite Roselawn was among the most impressive in your area – with its wildlife area (complete with bug hotel) and plant species that included seaside daisies, hebe, sage, lambs ear and lavender.
