## "The Church would seem foolish without lay people."

These words of Saint John Henry Newman perfectly describe the rationale for the Synod for a Synodal Church which opened in Rome last week. Pope Francis said, "The synod offers us the opportunity to become a listening church, to break out of our routine and pause from our pastoral concerns in order to stop and listen."

As the Dublin Diocesan Synodal Committee explains, "this Synod process is underpinned by the belief that Our God is not remote, but is involved in our affairs, has hopes and dreams for us as individuals, as parishes and as a diocese. God is pursuing His plan for the universe, but He desires and needs our cooperation – we are his eyes, ears, tongue, hands, and feet. We must therefore constantly try to detect His voice, listen, and pursue His will, as the Gospel Acclamation in today's Liturgy reminds us: "The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice, says the Lord." (John 10:27).

Archbishop Dermot Farrell describes the Synod as follows: "synodality has existed since the time of the early church, but which fell into disuse; it was revived by Pope Saint Paul VI as a way of gathering together a variety of voices from across the church. Later, the model was promoted by Pope Saint John Paul II, who convened many synods during his pontificate. Synodality is an attempt to harness the energy of all the members of God's people, to involve them in discerning what God's wants from us."

The Archbishop adds that we can engage with the Synodal process in the coming weeks by "by praying daily for the success of the process, by informing ourselves about what is happening in the process and by embracing its fruits as they emerge".

I conclude with the words of Pope Francis, "we ask the Holy Spirit first of all for the gift of listening: to listen to God, that with him we may hear the cry of the people; to listen to the people until breathing in the will to which God calls us."

National Fire Safety Week aims to enhance fire safety, particularly in the home.

In the new blended working world many of us are spending more time at home so it is more important than ever that we are all informed as to the steps we can take to protect ourselves and our homes from fire.

This year for Fire Safety Week we will be focusing particularly on fire safety in the home and that we are "Safer Together".

People will be encouraged to check in on their neighbours in the Community, particularly the Elderly and vulnerable.

#### How to keep your child safe online

If your child spends time online, you should understand the risks that could put them in danger. Online dangers include:

Loss of privacy: Sharing information in public that should be kept private (after information is posted online, it is outside your child's control)

**Inappropriate content:** Adult material, hate speech, violence, dangerous dares or challenges

**Cyberbullying:** Bullying in the form of abusive and threatening texts or emails, messages on social media and chat rooms, or the posting of photos or video clips

**Online grooming:** Individuals targeting children through sexual coercion or extortion, usually on social media or gaming platforms

The most important thing is to communicate with your children about what they are doing online. Familiarise yourself with the apps and websites they are using.

Talk to your child about the important features and settings they can use, including:

How to adjust the security and privacy settings

How to block or unfriend someone

How to delete their own profile and account How to deal with inappropriate content (such as: turn off the screen, use the back button, tell a trusted adult, or report the content to the website or app where they found it)

There are also practical ways to safeguard your child online. These include using:

**Parental controls:** Allowing you to manage your children's use of online services and devices

**Filters:** Restricting access to specific content by using services such as SafeSearch on search engines

**Time tracker tools:** Keeping track of your child's social media use through tools available on social media apps

Learning about the internet is the best way for you to protect your child from online dangers. You can get lots of information and advice on online safety on our website



Fundraising: A committee of teachers has been set up to promote this year's Christmas Shoebox Appeal. Every Year Team Hope, an Irish, Christian International Development Charity, send thousands of gift filled shoeboxes to children in Africa and Eastern Europe, living in communities affected by poverty, inequality, low incomes or conflict. Leaflets have been distributed to 1st and 2nd yr students this week, with more being delivered to the school later this week for other year groups. The shoeboxes must be ready for collection in the school by Friday 10th November at the latest. We encourage all students to get involved in this extremely worthwhile cause. The class who brings in the most boxes will also be given a halfday for their efforts.

**Wellbeing**: Coláiste Phádraig's Well-being Club for students, *The Kind Mind Club*, is back up and

running on a weekly basis. This club is facilitated by Ms. Farrell who is extremely passionate about promoting positive mental health and well-being and sharing her love of mindfulness. This club takes place on Thursdays at lunchtime in room 10 and it aims to provide a calm, relaxing and restorative space for students to pause and take a break from the busyness of school life. All students (and indeed all school staff!) are welcome to attend.

In this space, participants will learn how to introduce many formal and informal mindfulness practices into their lives. Ms. Farrell will also guide short meditations and share scientifically proven tools and techniques to help manage stress, anxiety and overwhelm; regulate emotions; improve focus and attention and calm both the mind and body. Mindfulness is a powerful skill, which when practiced regularly, can help us respond rather than react to situations, people, and challenges within our lives. It also creates more space, clarity, and peace within our minds. When we create this space, we are in a better place to study, focus, make decisions and learn! If you would like to practice mindfulness and/or meditation and learn invaluable life-long skills to help manage stress and anxiety, please express your interest to Ms. Farrell. To maintain the integrity of the club and to ensure that this space remains safe, calm, and welcoming for all, it is advisable to speak to Ms. Farrell prior to attending. A register of attendees will be logged each week.

Ms. Farrell is also in the process of setting up Coláiste Phádraig's first ever *Well-being Committee*. This committee aims to meet once per month to discuss, share and express ideas on how best Coláiste Phádraig can support student well-being. If any student (or teacher!) would like to be on this new, innovative and upcoming Committee, please speak to Ms. Farrell in Room 10 (The Well-being Room.)





Lucan Village Green Upgrade: The design team encountered significant delays in procuring a contractor to carry out site investigations (SI) works. The SI contractor completed the investigation works in late June and subsequently provided a report which enabled the design team to make final adjustments to the detailed design. The tender documentation is now being finalised by the design team. This will enable SDCC to commence the tender process for the appointment of a contractor in the coming weeks. Management anticipate that this will allow a contractor to commence in November and for the works to be completed before the end of 2024. It is proposed to


This week all our contributors have stayed relatively close to home. Paddy got as far as Dun Laoghaire and Joe was in Dublin Zoo.





Josie got as far as Carton House and amongst her photographs is one of the Tyrconnell Tower allegedly originally built by Richard Talbot 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Tyrconnell and intended for his mausoleum. Its official name is The Prospect Tower. The first record of a house at Carton was in the early seventeenth century.





Frances submitted photographs of the Mill and of the old Methodist Church in Celbridge. The church was constructed between 1855 and 1869 and since 1995 has been Cunningham's Funeral Home in the town. According to the Kildare Local History Society website the oldest part of the Mill goes back to 1785 or so and by 1815 it had become the largest woollen mill in the country employing 600 people. Over the succeeding years it was used for a variety of purposes. According to the website the last industrial activity was from 1966 to 1982 when it was taken over by Navan Carpets producing woollen yarn. In 1985 it was extensively restored as a

community and business centre, with small industry units, meeting rooms and activity facilities which are still used by the community.
