Lourdes - A special place



Last Thursday, five plane loads of pilgrims travelled to Lourdes as part of our annual Diocesan pilgrimage which takes place from September 7th to 12th and is being led by Archbishop Dermot Farrell.

When speaking about Lourdes, Pope Francis reminds us:

"Like Saint Bernadette, we stand beneath the watchful gaze of Mary. Let us ask Mary Immaculate for the grace always to relate to the sick as persons who certainly need assistance, at times even for the simplest of things, but who have a gift of their own to share with others."

Pope Benedict once said that the thin veil that separates heaven and earth is a little more transparent in Lourdes. Let us pray that we may remember that our lives are not just about us. They are part of God's providential plan, part of a story that stretches infinitely beyond what we can immediately grasp...for people of faith, there are no coincidences, only aspects of God's providence that we have not yet fully understood.

We are all familiar with the story of Saint Bernadette in Lourdes but perhaps a little less so with dozen or so years she later spent in Nevers where she worked in the infirmary as a member of the Daughters of Charity of Nevers. In the convent garden in Nevers, there is a statue of Our Lady of the Waters where St Bernadette would often go to pray. She said: "It is she who reminds me most of the lady I saw."

Speaking in Lourdes in 2019, Archbishop Emeritus Diarmuid Martin said the following: "It is here in the quiet and prayerfulness of the [Lourdes] Sanctuary and especially of this Grotto that we come in touch with the true message of Lourdes and that message touches and changes our hearts."

Let us pray to Our Lady of Lourdes and to Saint Bernadette that they will touch the hearts of all who are sick both in mind and in body that they may experience the healing grace of God's love.

Chiropody, podiatry and foot care services

What is chiropody and podiatry?

If you have problems with your feet or lower limbs, a chiropodist is a health professional that can examine, diagnose and treat any diseases or abnormalities your feet may have.

Chiropodists can also help alleviate painful symptoms and improve mobility.

Chiropodists are also often known as podiatrists. If you need chiropody services, you may be referred to a chiropodist by your GP or local public health nurse. You can also contact chiropodists directly.

How to get chiropody services in Ireland The availability of chiropody services from the Health Service Executive (HSE) can depend on the area you live in. Chiropody services may be provided by the Local Health Office or by voluntary organisations on behalf of the HSE.

Contact your GP, public health nurse or Local Health Office for information on chiropody services in your area.

Can I get chiropody services?

If chiropody is available in your area from the HSE, you will usually get priority if you have:

A medical card and are aged 66 and over

A Health Amendment Act card
An illness such as diabetes or arthritis

A disability

Chiropody treatment card

In some areas you can apply for a chiropody treatment card if you have a medical card, and you are:

Aged over 65 years or Living with Diabetes

You can check if this is available in your area and get an application form from your Local Health Office.

Tax relief and chiropody services

You may be able to claim tax relief on medical expenses if you pay for chiropody services. You can also claim tax relief on doctor visits and prescription drugs. Read more about tax relief for medical expenses on our website.

Chiropodist and podiatrist organisations

The Society of Chiropodists and Podiatrists of Ireland.

Irish Chiropodists/Podiatrists Organisation Ltd

Institute of Chiropodists and Podiatrists. You can ask them to check whether your chiropodist is registered as a member.

CORU, the Health and Social Care Professionals Council, is the organisation that will register and regulate podiatrists.

It appears that the very sad Glenview House property has been acquired by a UK development company who specialize in nursing home projects – D.V. a reincarnation perhaps to an era of loving care.





Storm Names for 2023 - 2024

Britain, Ireland and the Netherlands got their heads together once again to name the storms for the upcoming year. 21 names in total, and 7 have been chosen by Met Éireann, all dedicated to people in the world of science.



The Irish Selection:

Storm Agnes had been named after the Irish astronomer and science writer **Agnes Mary Clarke**, who died in 1907.

Storm Fergus, is in honour of scientist **Fergus O'Rourke**, who contributed to myrmecology and medical entomology before his death in 2010.

Storm Jocelyn, is in honour of **Jocelyn Bell Burnell**, an astrophysicist from Northern Ireland who discovered the first pulsating radio stars in 1967.

Storm Lilian, named after **Lilian Bland** (1878–1971), an Anglo-Irish journalist and pioneer aviator. She was the first woman in Ireland to build and fly an aircraft.

Storm Kathleen is dedicated to two Kathleens - **Kathleen Kay McNulty Mauchly Antonelli** (1921–2006), who was one of the developers of computer programming, and **Kathleen Lonsdale** (1903–1971), an Irish crystallographer who demonstrated the crystal structure of benzene.

Storm Nicholas, named after physicist **Nicholas Callan** (1799–1864), who invented the induction coil that was used in early telegraphy and is still used in some electronic devices today.

Storm Vincent, named after **Vincent Barry** (1908-1975), an organic chemist best known for leading the team that developed the anti-leprosy drug clofazimine.

Hopefully, we won't see too many of those storms. Only two arrived last season – Storm Antoni (*named by the UK*), and Storm Betty (*names by Met Eireann*) – only a few weeks back.

In later years, he loved attending as many matches watching Lucan Sarsfields and his Grandchildren Luke, Colm and Dara play and meeting his friends at the matches. It was a huge part of his life. St. Mary's Camera Soirée

Last week there was some hope that before the end of the Astronomical summer on 21st September we might get some good weather. Well, it has certainly come up trumps these past few days.

Paddy has been to Castletown House and its environs.

Castletown House was the first winged Palladian country house built in Ireland. It was constructed between 1722 and 1729 for William Connolly, the Speaker of the Irish House of Commons who was reputed to have been the

wealthiest man in Ireland at the time of his death.





Donal has got as far as the Aran Islands and also submitted photos of owls and birds of prey picking up on Irene's phot last week.





Turning to the Aran Islands the islands' geology is mainly Karst limestone, related to the Burren in County Clare, not the granites of Connemara and one of Donals photos shows the Karst landscape. Film buffs will know that the filming of "The Banshees of Inisherin" took place on Inishmore in August 202 and will recall the 1934 fictional documentary, "Man of Aran" written and directed by Robert J. Flaherty

about life on the islands. Finally, John Millington Synge first came to the Aran Islands in 1898 looking for inspiration and to learn the Irish language. Synge's work, "Playboy of the Western World" was inspired by a story he heard while on the islands.
