### Asylum seeker

An asylum seeker is a person who has left their country and is seeking protection in another country. Asylum seekers are also called international protection applicants.

Seeking asylum is a human right. When you ask for asylum at the border of a country, that country's authorities must examine your application. If you ask for asylum in Ireland, you must make an application for international protection. While you are waiting for a decision

on your application, the Irish State gives you accommodation, food and medical care. You are entitled to legal aid to help you with your application and appeals (if needed).

### When your application has been processed, you may be either:

Declared a refugee

Granted subsidiary protection status Granted permission to remain for humanitarian reasons

Refused international protection

You can appeal a refusal to the International Protection Appeals Tribunal.

While your application for international protection is being processed in Ireland, you have certain rights and duties under the International Protection Act 2015.

### **Rights of international protection applicants**

You must be given the opportunity to present your case fully, unless your application is inadmissible or is dealt with under the EU Dublin Regulation.

Your application must be assessed fairly and you should be treated with dignity and respect throughout the process.

### Staying in Ireland and accommodation

You can stay in Ireland while your application is being processed.

The International Protection Accommodation Services (IPAS) will give you somewhere to stay, and your meals will be provided for you. You are entitled to a daily expense allowance while you are waiting for your application to be finalised. **Grand Canal to Lucan Urban Greenway** plan is now out for public consultation these plans are available to view on South Dublin County Council portal.

### Maynooth to Leixlip project:

I attended a brief this week to discuss the plans to introduce a pilot scheme along the M4/N4. This was presented to us by Kildare County Council. The aim of the project is to assess the needs of the M4/N4 mainline corridor and junctions from Maynooth to Leixlip (junction 5) in terms of operational efficiency and safety. Additionally, it aims to assess alternative transport modes or routes within the study area. A Bus Priority Mode (BPM) lane will be part of design. This concept is new and should it be successful, this new design along a motorway will be the first in the country. Further updates will follow.

Sunday will be jam-packed will all kinds of goings-on in the village – make sure to look in on the Garda exhibition celebrating 100 years of the force.


### Fingers crossed for the weather!

An additional 24 students got over 500 points while another 28 students got over 400 points. This means that well over 50% of our LC students attained over 400 points this year.

The uptake of Higher Level in all subjects was in line with, and in many cases exceeded, the national averages. This reflects the sustained effort in recent years from Subject Departments to encourage as many students as possible to push themselves and stick at HL for longer.

Of course, it was not all about the high achievers on Results Day. The Learning Support Department are especially proud of the achievements of the students who they worked with over the years. Every student that availed of Learning Support passed their Leaving Cert in style this year. Their impressive grades were a true testament to the persistence, determination, resilience and application of each student. The class of 2022 can finally breathe a wellearned sigh of relief easy now and reflect on a job well done!


