September: Time of Carrot and Stick

This time of the year there are lots of carrots and sticks presenting before us all! I was walking in a school yard yesterday and passed by an apple and a pear tree, both laden with healthy fruit nearly ready for the picking. This sight was alongside the falling autumn leaves and forthcoming dormancy and evident overground growth. My sense of smell caught the smell of freshness from the fruit and that of decay from the mushy leaves underfoot.



The carrots and sticks present in the choices that we make this time of the year. The choices determine what resources we need in order to sustain a way of being where we can draw on the sustenance that we need along with the necessary time to let efforts reap fruits in the correct time also. As the trees currently hosting fruit need a fresh supply of nutrients to bring about the same growth next year, we need the same also in whatever form is relevant: balance of life, choice of family weekly activities, rest time.....

The results that the year will bear, grow from the moment we make a commitment to anything that becomes regular in our lives or for that year. For me, this month is the one which takes most effort as it is the foundational one with heavy lifting that will smooth the path for the months ahead, as is the case for anyone influenced by the cycle of the school year – most people.

The image of a stick is generally a negative one! Yet, we use sticks to ease pressure and give strength when climbing mountains; we use sticks to build beautiful and protective boundaries around property; we use sticks for many games..... Perception is sometimes everything! The image of a carrot or apple dangling before a donkey, mule or pony as a reward for work has almost always worked; unless the animal is exceptionally stubborn!

So with whatever sticks we need to support us as we climb into autumn, let's keep an eye on the carrot also!

Register to vote for the President before 7 October 2025

The Irish Presidential election will be held on Friday, 24 October 2025. Are you planning to vote?

You can vote in the Presidential election if you're:

An Irish citizen

Aged 18 years or over, and

Registered to vote

Check to see if you're already on

Register to vote

If you're not on the register, you must register to vote on or before 7 October 2025. You can register online at checktheregister.ie.

Registering for a postal vote

If you're eligible to vote by post, your application for postal and special votes must be received by your local authority on or before 29 September 2025. Find more about who can vote by post on our website or in the local CIC.

You cannot register to vote if you live outside Ireland, although there are some exceptions.

What is the Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance?

The closing date to apply for the Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance is **30 September 2025**

When can a driver be tested for drink and drugs?

Did you know?

As a driver, you should know that Gardaí can use a breathalyser to test you for alcohol levels and test your saliva for drugs.

It is an offence if you refuse to be tested for drink and drugs if the Gardaí stop your car.

When can I be tested for drink or drug driving?

Gardaí can set up a roadblock to conduct random alcohol and drug testing of drivers.

Drug testing after a car crash

If you are the driver in a serious car collision, the Gardaí must test you for drugs in your system at the roadside.

You must stay at the roadside until the test shows either a presence or absence of drugs in your system. This can take up to 30 minutes.

What happens if I am convicted of drink driving?

You will be disqualified from driving for a certain period and may have to pay fines or get a prison sentence.

It's now legal to cut your hedges

From Monday 1 September, it's the time of year you can start cutting your hedges again.

This is because it is illegal to cut hedges between 1 March and 31 August.

The ban gives species like birds the chance to nest safely and raise their chicks.





Open Night 2025: The Coláiste Phádraig Open Night will take place in the school on **Thursday 2nd October** from **7pm-9pm**. The Open Night is undoubtedly one of the highlights of our school calendar, with teachers, management, staff and students alike in attendance to showcase the fantastic array of modern facilities available in our school. There will be presentations, guided tours, classroom-based demonstrations and displays, quizzes, interactive games, dramatic performances and many other surprises and fun activities throughout the school on the night.

There will also be opportunities to chat with current students and hear about their school experiences to date, as well as learning about our wide range of extra-curricular activities including soccer, GAA, basketball, golf, badminton, athletics, music, film and graphics clubs and many other appealing activities for our students to get involved in.

We ourselves look forward to meeting the prospective students on the night who we hope will join the extended Coláiste Phádraig CBS family in the coming years. No registration required – just come along!



Soccer: The first round of trials for the 1st yr soccer team got underway last Wednesday and Thursday after school. A fantastic turnout saw 54 enthusiastic and talented first-year students take to the pitch, all eager to impress the coaches and earn a coveted spot on the school panel. With only 20 places available on the final panel, some very tough decisions lie ahead for the coaching team.

Transition Year: Our 90 TY students enjoyed an educational and fun afternoon at Explorium, Ireland's National Sports and Science Centre, located in Sandyford, over the past two Wednesdays. This much-anticipated outing was part of the school's TY programme, aimed at promoting experiential learning beyond the classroom.

The students were taken aback by the sheer size of the centre, which spans 110,000 square feet! The nervous TY students got to conquer their fear of heights by doing some exhilarating wall climbing under the guidance of experienced instructors. They also got to visit an augmented reality room where they got to experience a number of immersive experiences and games such as motor racing, boxing, sky diving, water slides and even trekking through the Amazon jungle! The G-force anti-gravity loop was another highlight as the daredevil types were harnessed

into a bicycle and rotated 360 degrees on a circular track.

They also visited the dedicated sports science unit and learned about anatomy, biology, nutrition, physiology and sports psychology. They then received a unique and intriguing talk entitled "How to find aliens", which explored the science behind the search for life beyond Earth.

The TY Horticulture class has been busy rejuvenating the school's memorial garden and tidying up the polytunnel in preparation for the year ahead. Their hard work is already paying off, and the space is looking refreshed and full of potential.

Every Wednesday, our Transition Year students are rolling up their sleeves and getting stuck into a new DIY module, under the guidance of Mr. Todd — and their first project has already made a noticeable impact.

The module kicked off with a practical and much-needed task: cleaning and tidying the school changing rooms. Over the course of a number of timetabled classes last Wednesday, students worked together to declutter, scrub, and reorganise the changing room space, transforming it into a cleaner and more functional environment for everyone.

1st yr news During their time in the Home Economics room this week, our 1st yr students put their culinary skills to the test in a fun and educational class focused on baking delicious chocolate cookies. The lesson began with a focus on understanding the key ingredients. Students discussed the role each one plays in baking – from butter and brown sugar to flour, eggs, and, of course, chocolate chips. They learned how to measure the correct quantities of each ingredient using a digital scale, which reinforced the importance of precision in baking.

A highlight of the class was learning how to crack an egg correctly, using one hand over the bowl to avoid shell fragments in the mixture – a skill that takes a bit of practice but is very handy in the kitchen! The students then used an electric mixer to blend their ingredients thoroughly, experiencing first-hand how different textures develop as ingredients combine.

Brown sugar was used in the recipe to give the cookies a rich, caramel-like flavour – a small detail that made a big difference to the final result. The classroom soon filled with the mouth-watering aroma of freshly baked cookies, and the students couldn't wait to try their creations!





UPDATE FROM NEPAL

Greetings one and all,

I hope this finds you all well and in good health. It has been a couple of years now since a Nagarmail has been sent out, but that's not to say nothing has happened in this time. Myself and my own family returned to Ireland just over 2 years ago in June 2023. It was a big move for myself after 18 long years full-time in Nepal and indeed for my wife and two children, uprooting our home and taking very little back with us on a plane.

In 2022, Nagarhope Basic School got funding for a 5-room earthquake proof primary block from the provincial government in Nepal. At a cost of about €75,000, half funded by Nagarhope Ireland, we spent the next 6 months or so constructing a vital infrastructure of the school. This block, which includes a library and computer lab has housed the four youngest classes for the last 2 years.

On its completion, we then set about improving the ground and surrounds, constructing support walls and metal barriers at all levels as well as a boundary compound for safety. The kids were delighted that now they literally do not have to run down the mountain when the football gets kicked down!

On my most recent visit in July 2025, I was thrilled to see so many old faces after two years, as well as many new ones. Nagarhope once paid the salaries of 10 staff members in the school, but we only cover five now, as the local municipality has doubled their own support over the last few years. Also on my brief trip back this year we started running a larger bus in the mornings and evenings due to overwhelming demand.

The village and its surrounds have seen such changes in the 11 years since we started running an infant class, everything from housing, roads electricity and clean running water, which were all once a dream are now a reality making life easier for the locals. Having a good road means villagers can transport crops easily to the markets and get a better price.

I'd like to think that one reason villagers have been not only happy to stay put, but indeed returned to the village from larger urban areas is because the education of their children is being taken care of. The standard of education given to the 120 kids attending Nagarhope Basic School is constant and of good quality. What we have built and continued improving over 10 years is exactly what the village of Sathikurya lacked in years gone by.

Nagarhope Ireland still supports teachers' salaries, mid-day meals for students and staff and supplements the cost of running the school bus, as well as contributing to other extracurricular activities and sports.

It has been a privilege for me to have been a part of it all since its inception and a sheer joy to revisit the school after two years to check up on them. I'd like to think that all the work Nagarhope has put into this project over the years will continue to bear fruit and provide a great education to the children of the area.

And whilst many people over the years have been involved on the ground in Nepal, none of this would have happened if not for the support and dedication of sponsors and donors back home in Ireland and elsewhere. Myself and the Nagarhope thank each and every one of you for your continued support and encouragement.

The Cross is an early 12th-century Irish Christian ornamented cusped processional cross, which was acquired in 1122 Tairrdelbach Ua Conchobair (Turlough O Connor) High King of Ireland to donate to the Cathedral church of the period that was located at Tuam, County Galway. The cross was subsequently moved to Cong Abbey at Cong, from which it takes its name. The Cross of Cong was made in 1123 to encase a fragment of the True Cross.
