Living in the present moment....

One day a man walked past a camp of elephants. Looking closer, he was surprised to see that these mighty animals weren't held in cages or kept in chains. The only thing stopping them from escaping? A thin rope tied from one of their legs to a simple pole in the ground. Confused, as to why they didn't use their strength to break the rope, he asked the trainer why they weren't attempting to run away. To this the trainer replied, "As baby elephants, we use the same system. But, at that age, the rope is strong enough to stop them from escaping. They grow up like this, believing they can never break the rope, so even as adults they stay put." In other words, these powerful, magnificent and intelligent elephants didn't *believe* they could free themselves, so they never tried. Our personal beliefs are powerful beyond measure and often dictate our outcomes. They can work for or against us. Identify your limiting beliefs so you can push against them.

As we journey in life, often of our greatest struggle, is to find ourselves in the present moment. How many of us are burdened and carry too much heavy baggage, because of past events and unresolved issues. How many of us may be overwhelmed and full of worry or anxiety, regarding what may happen down the road. In fact, very few are blessed with the freedom and contentment to live in the present moment. When I am present in the now, I am not consumed by what happened yesterday or fearful regarding what may occur tomorrow. The great St. Padre Pio, had a powerful spirituality regarding living in the present moment. Towards the end of his life, a life, that contained a huge amount of personal suffering, he made a profound prayer of serenity, rejoicing in his liberation, for being blessed just to live in the present moment. His prayer is a gift for all of us as we walk our daily pathway. The best pathway, proven by the wisdom of the elders, is one that takes one step, one moment at a time. Saint Padre Pio said, "My past life I give to your mercy, O Lord, whatever may happen tomorrow, I hand into your providence, Today, let me live in your love".

"Lead, Kindly Light"

I've been reading a biography of St. John Henry Cardinal Newman recently. I offer one significant moment of his life to ponder this week. In 1833, several years before his reception into the Catholic Church, he travelled to Rome. Then, on his return voyage, he became seriously ill and, at the same time, the ship was becalmed in the Mediterranean. That is, the winds ceased and the ship was more or less stalled, drifting, until the winds came back.

Newman's life coincided almost exactly with the 19th century — he lived from 1801 to 1890. It was a time of great advances in scientific knowledge, in mechanisation and industry. Political upheaval was widespread as well; old dynasties fell and experiments in new forms of government began. In all these fields, persons seemed to grasp a greater mastery of their own fates. And yet, even with all humanity's new knowledge and power, one could still be "becalmed." Nature could still do something that simply made you stop. On this occasion, while at sea, Newman wrote the poem "The Pillar of the Cloud," better known by the informal title, "Lead, Kindly Light." It has been set to many tunes, and has become a well-beloved hymn.

There isn't room for the whole text, but here's an excerpt:

Lead, Kindly Light, amid the encircling gloom Lead Thou me on!

The night is dark, and I am far from home — Lead Thou me on!

Keep Thou my feet; I do not ask to see The distant scene — one step enough for me.

It's a great expression of trust, and of patience: he doesn't ask to see "the distant scene" — the end of this road, wherever it goes. "One step enough," sufficient grace for the present, is all he asks. Both afflicted with illness, and unable to go anywhere, Newman put his faith in a Light, a Light he knew was kindly disposed to him, and was leading him to safe harbour. May the light of hope and peace bring us all great serenity and acceptance....

What is the Free Travel Scheme?

The Free Travel Scheme allows you to travel, free of charge, on public transport and some private bus and ferry services.

Everyone aged 66 and over, living permanently in Ireland, can get the Free Travel Scheme. People with disabilities and carers aged under 66 may also qualify for Free Travel.

If you qualify for Free Travel and you are married, in a civil partnership or cohabiting, your partner may travel with you for free. If you can't travel alone for medical reasons, you may get Free Travel for a companion. This allows a person aged over 16 to travel with you for free.



If you qualify for Free Travel, your Public Services Card (PSC) will have FT (for Free Travel) in the top left-hand corner. The letter following it shows who you can take with you:

FT-P - you can travel for free

FT+S - your spouse, partner or cohabitant can travel with you for free

FT+C - you can have a person (over 16) travel with you for free

You must carry it with you when you are using public transport.

Paper free travel passes are no longer being issued but you can still use your paper pass, if it is valid. Detailed information is available on Free travel in Ireland (citizensinformation.ie)

How to apply for Free Travel

If you are aged 66 or over and are getting a social welfare pension, your PSC will be issued showing that you have Free Travel automatically.

You must have completed the PSC SAFE registration process and be getting one of the following payments:

State Pension, Invalidity Pension, Blind Pension, Disability Allowance, Carer's Allowance.

If you are married or in a civil partnership, your PSC will be issued with FT-S on it. If you are cohabiting, you must fill in Part 1 and 2 of the Free Travel application form FT1 (pdf).

If you are not getting one of the payments above, but you are eligible for Free Travel you must fill in the Free Travel application form FT1(pdf).

If you can't travel alone

If you are unable to travel alone, you can apply for a Free Travel for a Companion, using either an Over 70 Companion pass form (pdf) or an Under 70 Companion pass form (pdf).

You can get an application form for Free Travel from the Department of Social Protection. The form is also available at your local post office and Citizens Information Centre.

Lost or damaged Free Travel pass or PSC

There are currently 2 types of Free Travel Pass - a paper Free Travel Pass and a Public Services Card with Free Travel (with F-T written in the top left-hand corner). Paper passes are no longer being issued so if you need a replacement for a lost or damaged paper pass you must undergo SAFE registration and get a Public Services Card. If your Public Services Card Free Travel is lost, stolen or damaged, you should telephone 0818 837 000 to request a replacement card.

Senior SmartPass for travelling in Northern Ireland If you are 66 or over and have Free Travel you can travel free of charge on all bus and rail services within Northern Ireland using a Senior Smartpass card

A spouse, civil partner, cohabitant or companion cannot travel with you for free on public transport within Northern Ireland. However, your Irish Free Travel allows your spouse, civil partner, cohabitant or companion to travel for free on certain cross-border services between Ireland and Northern Ireland. For example a cross-border train journey that starts in Ireland and ends in Northern Ireland or vice versa.

How to apply for a Senior SmartPass

To get a Senior SmartPass you must fill in an application form (FTNI1). You can get this form from your local Intreo Centre or Social Welfare Branch Office. It is not possible to get this form online.

Application forms for Senior SmartPass cards are also available at your local Citizens Information Centre.

You should not use a photocopy of the form as each form is barcoded. The application form must be filled in with black ink only and returned in person (not posted) to your Intreo Centre or Social Welfare Branch Office. You must bring the following items with your application form to your Intreo Centre or Social Welfare Branch Office:

Your Irish Free Travel pass/Public Services Card and Proof of your address, (for example, a gas, electricity, phone bill or bank statement) and Proof of your identity, (for example, your driving licence, passport or another form of photo identification) and

A recent passport standard colour photograph. It may take up to 6 weeks to process your application. There is further information on the extension of the Free Travel Scheme.

Renewing and replacing a Senior SmartPass

Your Senior SmartPass will expire after 5 years. If you have electronically used your card within the last 2 years, you will get a new card automatically in the post from Translink when your card expires. If you have not used your card in the last 2 years, you will be sent a renewal application form to fill in. (The renewal form is not the same as a first-time application and you do not need to supply a photograph.)

If you have never used your card, you will not hear from Translink at all. If you wish to get it renewed, you must contact Translink by email at smartpass@translink.co.uk or telephone 00 44 289 075 9129 and they will send you a renewal application.




