They both loved every interaction with people giving and gaining lots in each instance.

As we look at the year ahead of us with a broad-brush sweep and consider how many 'things' we have to do in the months ahead, the quality of every moment and of every day can easily be eroded or forgotten. This day, today, will never come our way again! The opportunity to experience people today will be unique in the moment. Look at the friendships that have grown from a small chance encounter! Look at the opportunities that come our way when we are least expecting them! Challenges come in much the same way – how we deal with them makes all the difference. The universe is not out to get any of us, even though it seems like that on some days!

In this crazy, busy month of September, if we were to take five minutes, daily, to stop and interact with someone with whom we don't usually talk or give a few moments of real listening to someone each day – it would make a difference to both ourselves and those with whom we interact! Alternatively, or as well, to take time each day just to evaluate or reconsider what we do or how we are, so that we can be the difference we might need.

Doing the best with every day leads to doing the best with all of life! No regrets!

### The Presidential Election

The President of Ireland (Uachtarán na hÉireann) is elected directly by the people of Ireland for a term of 7 years. The President can then run for reelection for another 7-year term but may not serve more than 2 terms.

The current President is Michael D. Higgins. He was inaugurated on 11 November 2011 and reelected in October 2018.

# When is the next presidential election in Ireland?

A presidential election must take place in the 60 days before the term of the current president ends on 11 November 2025 - the date of the election is Friday 24 October, 2025. If a President resigns, dies or becomes incapacitated, an election must be held during the 60-day period that follows.

# Who can vote in a presidential election?

To vote in a presidential election, you must be:

An Irish citizen Aged 18 or over

Ordinarily resident in Ireland\* and

Registered to vote

\*There are special arrangements for Irish officials on duty abroad (and their spouses or civil partners) who may register on the Postal Voters List. You can use checktheregister ie to see if you are currently registered to vote. Read more about registering to vote on our website.

#### Who can run for President of Ireland?

To be eligible for election as President, you must be an Irish citizen who is 35 or older. You must be nominated either by:

At least 20 members of the Oireachtas

At least 4 local authorities

Former or retiring Presidents can nominate themselves

#### How does the presidential election work?

Voting is by secret ballot and based on proportional representation by the single transferable vote.

Most people will vote in person at their local polling station. Postal voting is available to certain people who may be unable to vote in person.

If only one candidate is nominated for the office of President, an election is not needed.

The President of Ireland (Uachtarán na hÉireann) is the head of State, as set out in Articles 12–14 of the Constitution (Bunreacht na hÉireann).

# The functions and powers of the President

The formal powers and functions of the President are prescribed in the Constitution.

Many of the powers of the President can only be exercised on the advice of the Government.

For example, Government approval is required to address the Houses of the Oireachtas, or address a message to the nation, on a matter of national or public importance.

However, there are a limited number of areas in which the President has absolute discretion, such as in referring a Bill to the Supreme Court for a judgment on its constitutionality or in refusing to dissolve (end) Dáil Éireann (lower house of parliament) on the advice of a Taoiseach (Prime Minister) who has ceased to retain a majority.

#### Representing the people

As a representative of the Irish people, the President makes State visits abroad and receives other Heads of State on visits to Ireland. The role also includes receiving the credentials of foreign diplomats accredited to Ireland, undertaking a wide range of public engagements, and organising awards such as the Gaisce and the Centenarian Bounty.





#### **Past Pupil Business Success**



Leaving Cert Results: Congratulations to all of our Leaving Cert students who received their exam results on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> August. The results were issued directly to students through the State Examinations Commission's candidate selfservice online Student portal at 10am We would like to sincerely congratulate the class of 2025 on their very impressive results this year. This year's cohort achieved, on average, five CAO points higher than last year's group — a clear indication of the continued academic progress and commitment to excellence that defines our school. While just one student attained over 600 points — slightly fewer than in previous years — what stands out this year is the notable improvement in the lower and mid-range of results, showing a broader and more inclusive distribution of success across the year group. This improvement reflects not only the hard work of the students but also the consistent dedication of their teachers and the wider school staff. Well done to Alex D'Alba on achieving the best Leaving Cert results in the school. Alex applied himself from his 1st day in school and his outstanding results were a just reward for his phenomenal work-ethic, extraordinary dedication and unwavering commitment to academic excellence. Alex also attained the school's 1st ever H1 in Italian! Bravo Alex!

The uptake of Higher Level in all subjects was in line with, and in many cases exceeded, the national averages. This reflects the sustained effort in recent years from Subject Departments to encourage as many students as possible to push themselves and stick at HL for longer.

A particularly notable highlight this year came from our Leaving Certificate Computer Science students. In what is only the fifth year of the subject being examined nationally, our students have outperformed the national average significantly. There was a 100% uptake of Higher Level in the subject this year, and an impressive 20% of our Computer Science students achieved a H1 grade, which was double the National Average.

Of course, it was not all about the high achievers on Results Day. We would also like to pay special tribute to the Resource Department, whose work over the years has helped ensure that every student has the opportunity to reach their potential. Students who availed of additional educational supports have, once again, achieved excellent results — a testament to their perseverance and the patient, expert support provided by the SEN team. The role of inclusive education is central to our ethos, and it is

inspiring to see how students of all abilities have flourished.

On August 28th, the first round of CAO offers was released, marking a major milestone for the Class of 2025. The school is proud to report that the vast majority of our students received offers in courses aligned closely with their preferences, with many securing their first-choice options.



1st yr news: We are thrilled to welcome our 144 new 1st Year students who have joined our school community this year. From their very first day, these students have impressed everyone with their co-operation, good manners, enthusiasm, and genuine positivity. Their smooth transition from primary to post-primary education has been a joy to witness, and it's clear that this is going to be a fantastic year group to work with.

One of the first challenges they faced was learning how to use their coded locks and lockers — a small but important part of becoming more independent. They've already mastered the routine of preparing for each class and bringing the right materials and books, a habit that will stand to them throughout their school years. Getting used to moving from classroom to classroom between every subject is another big change from primary school. Our 1st Years have handled it superbly, showing great organisation and time management. Whether it's Irish, Science, Wood Technology, Home Economics, German or French, they've taken on every new subject with interest and curiosity.

Over the course of the past week, the students have also had opportunities to meet their Principal and Deputy Principals, as well as their dedicated Year Head Mr. Lyons, who will guide and support them during their time in 1st yr. They also met their Class Tutors, who have played a vital role in helping them settle in. These tutors have guided the students through the practicalities of school life — from understanding their timetables, to using the various school facilities, and becoming familiar with the wide range of wellbeing supports available.

We are so proud of how well our 1st yrs have begun their journey. The positive energy they've

brought to the school has not gone unnoticed.

I can confirm that SDCC said no restriction or security personnel stopping public access to the car park will occur again.

SDCC & Aura plan to lower car park barriers for 30 minutes each morning during school dropoff for Gaelscoil Eiscir Riada.
